Funeral services were held Saturday at the Bair funeral home, Philadelphia, for Wilbur Reeder Decker, brother of James E. Decker, of Blanchard street, Bellefonte, who died Wednesday, May 1, 1940, in the Veterans' Hospital, Coatesville. Interment took place in the National cemetery, North Philadelphia. Mr. Decker was born in Boalsburg 47 years ago, a son of James A. and Catherine Rishel Decker. His wife, the former Mary Senda, of Struthers, Ohio, and two daughters at home, survive. In addition to Mr. Decker, another brother, J. Homer, Washington, D. C., and the following sisters survive: Mrs. R. G. Markel and Mrs. M. A. Foster, Altoona; Mrs. John Auman and Mrs. Walter Martin, Philadelphia, and Mrs. William Knisely, of York. Mr. Decker was a member of Troop L, Bellefonte, National Guard unit, having served as a color sergeant under the late Mayor H. L. Curtin. During the World War he was in Camp Hancock, Ga. The deceased, who had been suffering from a heart condition, had been a patient in the hospital at Coatesville for two years.

withheld for her own protection, motored to Philipsburg last Thursday afternoon with a companion to board a bus for Clearfield. On the way to Philipsburg their car was stopped by another machine, which followed closely. Upon arriving at Philipsburg, the State College clerk was walking toward the bus station when the driver of the car which had trailed them walked up behind her and asked "Where are you going?"

The girl went into a confectionery store, and the man followed, but left upon being repulsed in his advances. When she emerged from the store he again walked beside her to the bus depot, where she finally got rid of him.

The man is described as being short, stocky build, with dark hair and of dark complexion. He wore a tweed coat and gray suit, and had unusually piercing eyes.

Saturday morning a clerk in a State College business place was counting money nearby an open window when a man answering the description of the one who molested the driver of the car which had trailed them, appeared at the window, stared intently for a few moments, and remained there until the girl fled into another room. Eagle in a large caravan of automobiles.

Most of the 80 members of the Howard Nursery CC Camp, not far from Mt. Eagle, also were present at the funeral.

Four large cars were required to transport the floral tributes to the cemetery, and in all, a total of 307 cars were parked in the vicinity of the church during the services.

State Motor Police were on hand to direct traffic, and for the more grim purpose of searching among the crowd for any possible clues as to the identity of the person who caused the girl's death.

Sheriff Edward R. Miller and a number of deputies were on hand to preserve order and to guarantee that the wishes of the family in respect to indiscriminate photography by newspapermen were carried out. No photographs were permitted in the church or in the cemetery.

After the services, which lasted about an hour, the cortege wound over the dusty detour, past the site of the slaying to Curtin where the girl's remains were laid to rest. The victim's mother, who has not been in good health and whose condition was greatly aggravated by the blow of her daughter's death, attended the services, but required assistance during the ceremony. The girl's grief-stricken father, and her sisters and brother also were there.

Award For Husband's Suicide

The State Workmen's Compensation Board upheld an award of \$2,437 to the widow of a miner who hanged himself, ruling that the man died as a direct result of injuries suffered during his employment. Matthew Madani of MeKeesport, was injured Dec. 6, 1935 when a ceiling post in a mine fell upon him. The board found his injuries caused a mental breakdown responsible for his suicide on the Fourth of July, 1936.
