

To Prepare Javelle Water Dissolve one pound of washing oda in our mut of boiling water hands can be much improved by a coat of asphaltum varnish soda in one quart of boiling water, and 1/2-pound of chloride of lime

in two quarts of cold water. Pour the clear portion of the lime solution into the soda solution and allow to stand for settling. Decant the clear liquid into bottles, cork tightly, and keep in a dark place.




