Islands are all right in the sea, but an island of light in a dark room is something to be avoided. Have you ever noticed how often you see things out of the corners of your eyes? This ability has been greatly developed by the human eye for our own protection.

Any unusual action or contrast of light—or even color—when seen from the corners of the eyes, is a command of the mind to look up and see what is happening.

These commands are often valuable ones, but when we are sitting quietly at home reading or sewing they are unnecessary.

In spite of this, if we are sitting beneath a single, glaring light in a

dark room, the commands go on. Nature says, "Look into the darkness." Your sewing says, "Look more closely at me." The result is a tug of war ending in nervousness and eyestrain—that has actually been measured in lighting laboratories.

Just look at the woman in the top photograph. Her sewing is actually a tedious task—and those lines caused by squinting aren't going to keep her looking young—and oh! that back ache from leaning down closer to the needle!

But—ah! Look at her now—doesn't she look happy? Knitting can be fun, can't it—especially if you can sit back comfortably under a good light.

Of course that lamp by the davenport was too nice to discard—even if it did give poor light—so it was converted into a lamp that conforms with good lighting standards by merely adding a diffusing bowl and the right size bulb—100 watts—and a white-lined shade.

An I. E. S. end table lamp has been placed at the other side of the davenport for balance and more general illumination—to take away that effect of "spotty" illumination.

Why not "light condition" your living room for the longer evening ahead? And we'll wager that after you have "made over" the lighting in one room you'll be so pleased you won't stop till you've light conditioned the whole house.

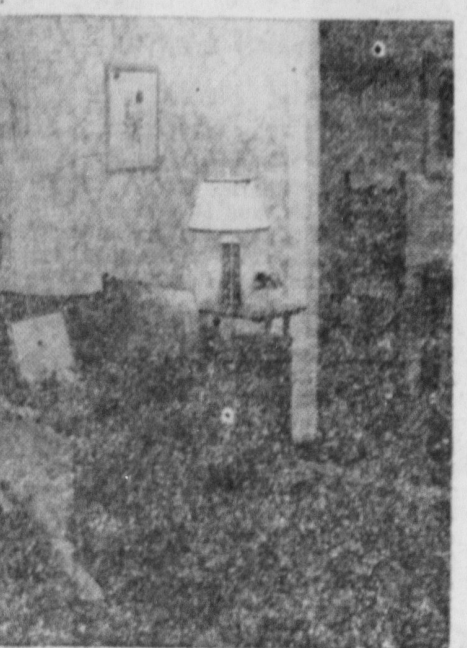
