### To Open Mattress Centre At Spring Mills

Mattresses for families with net incomes less than \$500 yearly will be made under the direction of the Agriculture Conservation Division of the Department of Agriculture, it was announced yesterday by the Bellefonte office. A work center will be set up this week at Spring Mills and will be sponsored by the Gregg Township Civic Club.

The material for the mattresses is supplied by the Department of Agriculture without charge and instructors are provided to supervise the making of the mattresses. Members of the families who are to receive the mattresses do the actual work in making them, it was explained. Eighty-five cents is charged for needles, hauling of materials and other minor costs.
