transfer he became a conductor, remaining in that post until 1913 when he was appointed Bellefonte yardmaster. He retained that title until 1934 when the position was abolished and he was made conductor on the Snow Shoe branch, a post he has filled capably up to the present time. Mr. Kelleher's training as a boy well fitted him for his life's work. His father, a fireman for the company, took him on many of his travels, and before he went to railroading Thomas, better known as "Joe," worked with contractors building roads and telephone lines on the Tyrone Division. Early in life he came to know scores of engineers, conductors, brakemen, foremen and other railroaders. Mr. Kelleher enjoys railroading and even after 50 years of service, looks forward to each day with the same anticipation as he did in his youth. He has had remarkably little time off because of sickness. In his lifetime, Mr. Kelleher has seen many railroad wrecks, but was fortunate in escaping major mishaps. He was aboard the locomotive which cracked the long high trestle which formerly spanned Spring Creek from the Pike Quarries to North Thomas street. He recalls that when the bridge cracked, the engine turned on full speed and succeeded in reaching the siding in safety. It was the last locomotive ever to cross the span.

A. & P. Introduces 'Enriched Bread'

In response to the National Research Council's much-discussed recommendations for new white bread nutrition standards, the Great Atlantic & Pacific Tea Company today announced a new white loaf, enriched with Vitamin B1 and other mineral factors to the nutritional level of whole wheat bread. O. H. Weimer, general superintendent of the food chain's Altona unit, said the action "is in line with intensified government interest in making these essential food elements more widely available on the national defense effort's civilian front."

The new loaf will be available in A & P stores throughout this area at the same price as the old loaf, the food official said. Each pound of the company's "Marvel" bread, Weimer explained, will contain 450 International Units of the "Morale-building" vitamin generally known as B1 and added quantities of iron and the pellagra-preventive vitamin. Use of a large proportion of milk also provides calcium and riboflavin—Vitamin B2—which are essential to normal growth. These vitamin and mineral additions not only meet standards proposed by the National Research Council's committee on food and nutritional needs, but make this white bread the equal of average whole wheat bread in these vitamin and mineral factors, he said. Heretofore much of the vitamin and mineral value of wheat has been lost in the milling process due to Americans' preference for delicate white bread, it was explained. The result has been that although white bread has been an important staple food, it has been relatively low in certain minerals and vitamins of the "B complex." Restoration of these elements, according to nutrition experts, makes white bread one of the richest food sources of these essential vitamins.
