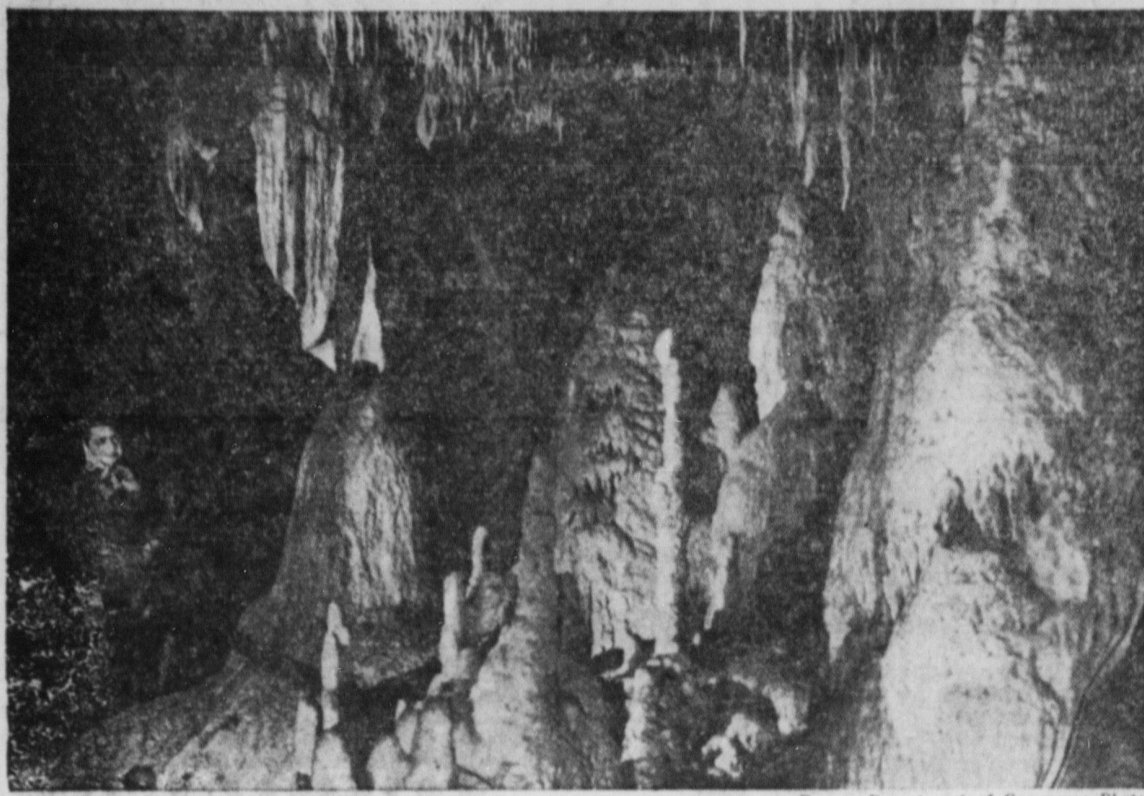


Penna. Caves Are a Growing Attraction to Visitors

3. Fix shifter on drill press No. 96 in the Machine Shop so that speed can be changed from low to high without reaching in with hands to lift the shifter clear of the press. Submitted by Clifford Jodon. Award \$2.00.

HOUSEHOLD SCRAPBOOK

Making a "Rose Jar" When it is desired to make a "rose jar," gather the petals from several types of roses, selecting those with a heavy perfume. Then sprinkle the petals over a flat surface in the sun and leave until they have dried very crisp. Finally, put them into a jar and put on the cover. The fragrance will last for several months.
Thicker Eyebrows To thicken the eyebrows, gently brush in every other night a few drops of oil of castor, always brushing from the nose outward. Remove with tweezers any hairs that by their position or irregularity injure the perfect outline that the brow should possess.
Whitening Sport Shoes Why not try using some ordinary painters' masking tape for whitening any colored leather while whitening sport shoes?
Prevent Mercuric Shrinkage To help prevent mercuric on cream or fruit-filled pies from shrinking while cooking, be sure that it covers the entire top of the pie and touches the rim of the crust. Bake the meringue for about 15 minutes in a slow oven and keep it out of a draft while it is cooking.
Smoother Fudge One teaspoon of cornstarch added to each cup of sugar used in making fudge will make it smooth and creamy while beating.
Unvarnished Furniture Unvarnished furniture can be polished with beeswax and turpentine.
Unshiny Weeds To prevent grass and weeds from growing between the bricks of the driveway, the best case oil over them two or three times a season. The oil will soon evaporate and the weeds will be killed.
Salted Peanuts Peanuts can be salted in the shell if they are boiled in salt liquid and then allowed to dry.
Rustic Furniture The bark surface on rustic furniture will be prevented from peeling if it is given a coat or two of spar varnish.
Tight Shoes Tight shoes, that pinch unbearably, can be relieved by laying a cloth, wrung out in hot water, over the area that pinches. Leave on for several minutes. The warm moisture will cause the leather to stretch and ease the discomfort.

Health and Beauty

CORONARY THROMBOSIS Coronary thrombosis is getting to be a frequent cause of death among men a little past middle age. It is caused by a blood clot in the artery that supplies blood to the heart. If you inspect a water pipe that has been in use a long time, you discover at times that the inside or bore has been rusted in places, and is rough and irregular. In such pipes the water must flow more slowly and irregularly. In youth, the blood vessels are smooth and elastic, so much so that they can expand. This expansion permits a more rapid flow which takes place after running or very violent exercise when the heart beats very fast and rushes the blood through its vessels in order to oxygenate it. As time goes on, the arteries begin to harden like an old rubber tube. The inner coats grow rough and thicken. This is called arteriosclerosis. When this occurs, it is much harder for the heart to pump the blood through the stiffened vessels, so it must work more rapidly and with greater force to keep up the circulation. But with no elasticity in the vessels, the blood moves more slowly than formerly, which may cause a clot to form in an artery which supplies the heart itself. The medical term for this condition is thrombosis. This cuts off the supply of blood to the heart and causes degeneration of some of the muscles. The attack is ushered in by a severe pain in the chest, which is followed by fever, weakness, and lassitude. The doctor must be immediately summoned and the patient kept very still and quiet until his arrival. An experienced physician will have no difficulty in diagnosing the case, and will at once administer a hypodermic to relieve the pain. However, the patient must be made to realize that his life depends upon a prolonged rest and the proper care, together with a suitable diet. At first, he may suffer from nausea, which will probably soon pass, after which small amounts of liquid may be administered. From now on, very few if any drugs are necessary. The doctor in attendance will be the judge of what to eat. The physician always watches for heart failure, which he treats very promptly with the proper drugs. Diet and rest, together with freedom from worry are the most important therapeutic measures in the restoration of the patient. People must slow down. The speed and high tension of modern life is taking its toll. Heart failure and coronary thrombosis are increasing at a very rapid rate. If you want to spare your heart, you must strike a more even tempo and stop going at such a rapid rate. You'll live longer. The democracies of the world ought to appreciate sea-power.

Little Victim Reported to Have Died in Front of Gasoline Tank Dashing out from behind a bread truck into the path of a gasoline truck, four-year old Elliott Helms, Jr., of Mt. The lad suffered a crushed chest and a possible skull fracture, it was learned.

NAVY ENLISTMENT OFFICER TO MAKE REGULAR VISITS

Throughout the summer and until further notice there will be a Navy representative at the Bellefonte post office on the second and fourth Thursdays of each month. The office hours in both places will be from 10 a. m. to 2 p. m. daylight time. The Navy is now accepting enlistments of four and six years for men between the ages of 17 and 50.
