

DELAY SELECTION OF HOSPITAL SITE

Officer Predicts No Immediate Decision

Committee Separates, Will Not Meet for Several Weeks... LOCAL SITE STILL BEING CONSIDERED... Bellefonte Location Said to be One of Several "Preferred" Tracts

Reliable sources in Washington last night quoted Col. George T. Ijams, of the Veterans' Bureau as saying that it is improbable that any early decision will be reached in regard to the site for the proposed new Veterans' Hospital for Central Pennsylvania.

Col. Ijams, member of a four-man committee from the Veterans Administration which last week inspected eight proposed sites for the institution, including the one at Bellefonte, indicated that final action may lag for several reasons.

300 COUNTIANS ARE ASSIGNED NUMBERS FOR ARMY DRAFT

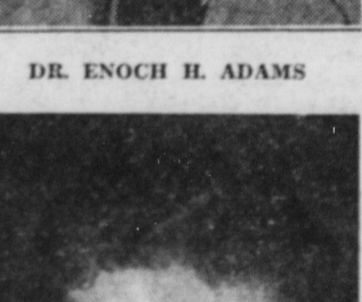
