Hundreds File For Offices

ered an important factor, the general belief being that positions at the head or near the end of the list receive more "undecided" votes than those with positions near the middle. The positions are drawn by lot, an ordinary pool "pill box" being employed. If there are six candidates for an office, six "pills" numbered from 1 to 6 are placed in the box and shaken. Each candidate draws one "pill" and the number on it decides his position. In case a candidate is absent at the drawing, the Commissioner names someone to act in his place.

A survey of the petitions filed with the Commissioners before the legal deadline Monday, reveals that while there are a number of candidates for some borough and township offices, there are no candidates for other offices which will be vacated this year.

In such cases, the voters may nominate persons whose names do not appear on the ballot by writing in names, or by pasting on stickers furnished by persons who decide between now and election time to become candidates.

Bellefonte Borough
In Bellefonte Borough, Mayor Hardman P. Harris, Rep., has no Republican opponents for re-election, and no Democratic candidate filed for that office.

In the North Ward, Walter R. Eberhart and Newell B. Long, both Republicans, are candidates for Council. Councilman Thomas H. Beaver and W. J. Eberick, whose terms expire this year, did not file for re-election. Harry E. Mauck, Rep., is a candidate for re-election in the West Ward, and Russell J. Lambert is the sole candidate for Council from the South Ward.

Lambert is a Republican. The term of H. A. Brockerhoff, Democrat, expires this year, and he did not file a petition. Edward J. Teaman, Democrat, filed for re-election from the West Ward.

Although three school directors must be elected this fall, only two candidates filed. One is Mrs. Ruth W. Hartwick, Dem., and the other is William B. Troupe, Rep., who recently was appointed to that post by the board to serve until after the election. Dr. E. H. Adams, Rep., the other recent appointee to the board, failed to file a petition. Franklin B. Schad, Rep., whose term expires this fall, did not file for re-election.

Two Democrats filed petitions for the office of Tax Collector. They are D. Wagner Gable and Charles P. M. Smith, of Pine street. The Republican party has no scarcity of candidates for Tax Collector, nine persons having filed petitions. They are: William H. Brown, Joseph F. Abt, Raymond Ammerman, George M. Brown, John L. Shultz, Wilbur H. Barney, William J. Benford, Edward L. Johnson, and Paul M. Dubbe.

John S. Walker, Republican, filed for re-election as borough auditor. No Democrats have declared for that post.

William H. Brown, who is a candidate for re-election as Justice of the Peace in the North Ward, has no opposition in either party for that office.
