Pronounce min-i-a-tur, both i's as in it, a as in ask unstressed, u as in unite, accent first syllable, and not min-i-atur. Sordous. Pronounce so-no-rus, first o as in obey, second o as in no, u as in up unstressed, accent second syllable. Valet. Pronounce va-let, a as in at, e as in egg, accent first syllable. Waive. Pronounce i-o-wa, i as in lie, o as in obey unstressed, a as in ask unstressed, accent on first syllable. Circuit. Pronounce sur-kit, u as in fur, i as in in, accent first syllable.

A & P's Produce Buying Increased

(Continued from page one) opening of the drive on May 19 to its close on July 26—represented a 5,629-carload increase over the 27,374 carloads bought during the corresponding period of 1940. Baum said, "Principal items purchased in producing areas throughout the country included watermelons, peaches, beans, cabbages, oranges, grapefruit, strawberries and tomatoes. "The results achieved by the A. & P. in its campaign to cooperate in the federal government's Food-for-Defense program indicate strongly what can be done to help get the proper nutritious foods onto the dining tables of the nation," Baum said. Discussing plans to extend the merchandising efforts beyond the campaign's close, Baum said growers had requested that the efforts be continued in order to help them move their crops rapidly through the summation during the approaching peak production periods in many areas. "The drive was timed to coincide with peak production periods during the early summer," the chain official said, "so that we could help growers and at the same time encourage wider use by the nation's housewives of the vitamin-bearing foods that federal nutrition experts say are essential to the country's health." "The urgent need for promotions of this kind is sharply emphasized by government reports that 46,000,000 Americans are getting diets below the safety line for the protection of health," he pointed out. "U. S. Department of Agriculture reports estimate that a 70 to 100 per cent increase in consumption of fruits and vegetables is necessary in order to meet minimum dietary standards."
