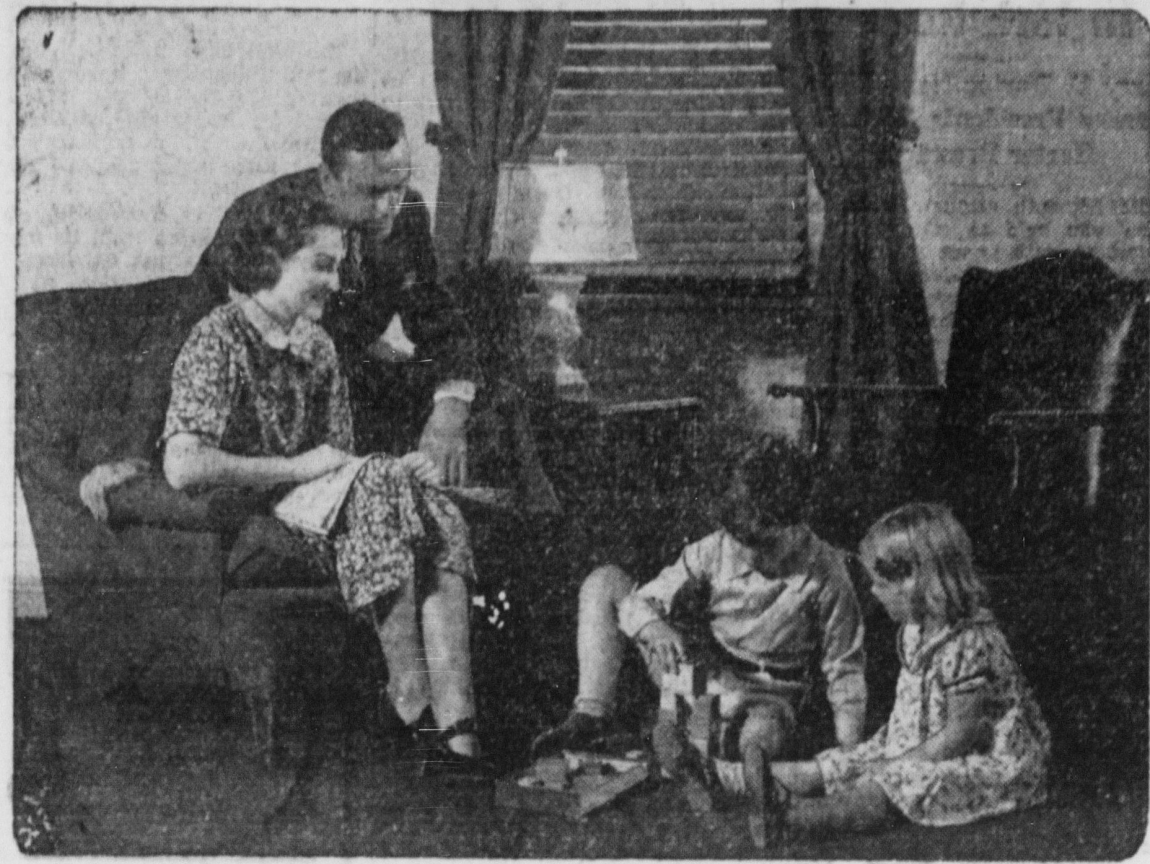

Home Sweet Home Is Comfortable Now



Dad has discarded his coal shovel and joined the rest of the family for a cozy evening at home—an automatic stoker fires the furnace for him and keeps the house at a healthy, even temperature.

This happy family will be healthier this winter, now that an automatic coal stoker guards their comfort. Regulated by a thermostat, the stoker fires the furnace evenly to maintain a constant temperature. This means that the family will have fewer colds which are often due to fluctuating temperatures—too much heat at one time, and then as the fire dies down, a sudden chill. The floors will be warm and free of drafts so that the youngsters can safely play there. The house can be kept warm day and night, whether anyone is home to watch the fire or not.

Convenience

The stoker feeds the furnace at the right times and in the right amounts to keep a uniform temperature which, in turn, is controlled by the thermostat. Handfiring is completely eliminated by the bin-type of stoker, and reduced to

a minimum with the hopper type. Proper feeding and combustion does away with the ash-removal nuisance, too. With the coal used in this section, a few clinkers will be formed which can be removed with tongs.

A cleaner home is a healthier home. With proper combustion there is less smoke and soot to soil draperies and rugs, walls and woodwork. The hopper and bin are neat and tidy, which actually makes the basement room usable as a playroom or hobby corner. The stoker coal itself is cleaner than the usual type, as impurities have been removed and it has had an oil treatment to prevent dust.

Stoker-firing not only relieves Mother of the drudgery of "coal-heaving" during the day, but saves her hours of work in housecleaning. She has more time to spend with the children, is less tired at the end

of a busy day. Dad is relieved of the chore of firing up in the morning and banking the fire at night. He can take an extra 40 winks in the morning, knowing that the family will find the house comfortable when they get up. It's certainly no fun to stumble downstairs in the chilly dawn and find, as like as not, that the fire has gone out.

Economy

A stoker is not an extravagance. Stoker coal is no more expensive, and in some cases, cheaper, than the coal ordinarily used. Its economy to get the most for your money—and a stoker helps you do that by giving the most heat, comfort and convenience from your heating system.

Now's the time to do something about it—to find out about a stoker so that you'll be ready for Old Man Winter.

William B. Troupe suggested that even though the architects had reported that removal of the earth would not weaken the foundations, it might be well to wait until the structure has "settled" on its foundations before taking away the earth. Mr. Schad cast the only dissenting vote on approving the project.

Board members pointed out that the earth can be taken away much easier and at much less expense now than will be the case after the structure is completed. A power shovel can be used at this time, and the cost will be approximately \$500 it was reported.

Board member Schad reported that officers of the Central Labor Union of Centre County for some time have been attempting to get a conference with Contractor Earl Cump to discuss Union matters in conjunction with the school construction, but that so far Mr. Cump has not granted such a conference. Schad offered a motion that the board call a conference between Mr. Cump and the Union and that the Board sit in on the conference solely as spectators.

When no second to the motion was made the suggestion was declared lost.

Dr. Enoch H. Adams, newly appointed member of the Board, made his initial appearance at the meeting and received the oath of office from Board president Horace J. Harrison.

As the meeting came to a close, it was announced that another special session is to be held soon to consider applications for a coaching-teaching post on the high school faculty, and to establish rules regarding music instruction to be followed when school opens. The vacancy was caused when Clarence B. Hendrickson, of Litz, elected recently to the post, submitted his resignation to accept another position.

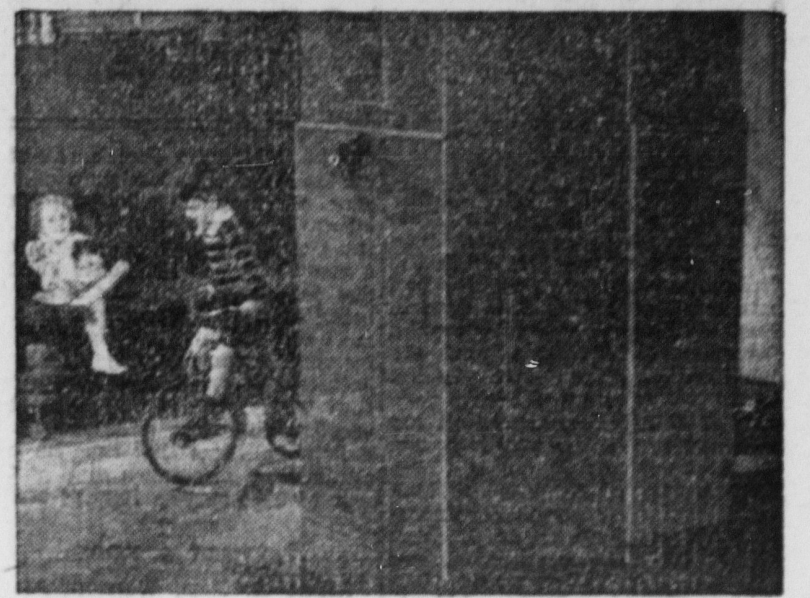
FRANK MACKAY FAMILY GATHERS IN REUNION

Automatic Heat Is Healthier for Children

Best of all, perhaps, is the convenience of a stoker—something any mother will appreciate. There's no need to leave the baby crying in his crib while she runs down to shake up the fire or adjust the drafts. The stoker tends the fire.

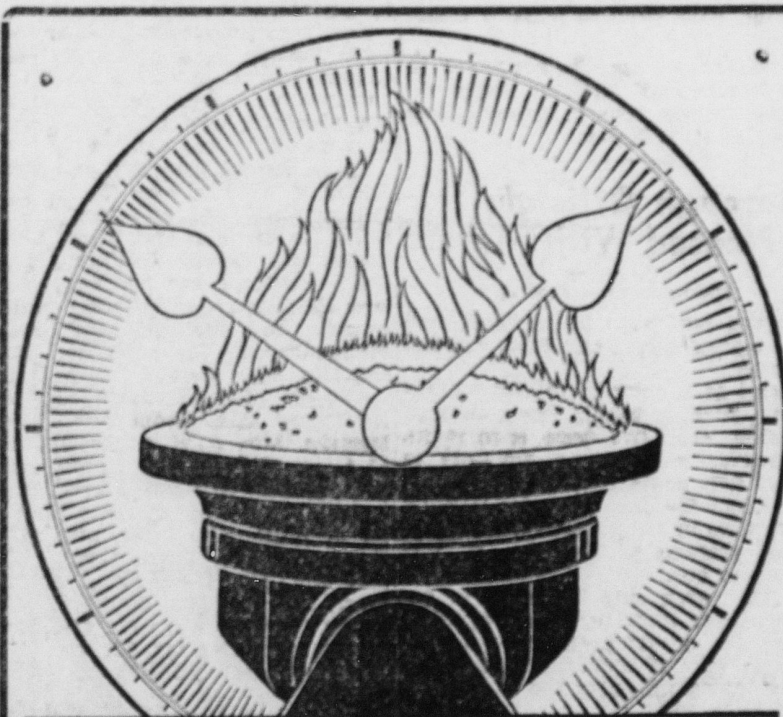
