## 16-Year Old Girl Brutally Attacked

heard a scream, but he believed that it was a neighbor's child. Shortly afterward, he said, he heard a woman crying, and the Lyons girl staggered to the porch. Miss Lyons told the Reeds and Mr. Eckley that a man had struck her with his fist. She said that she was walking from her home in Lyontown to Bellefonte when a car, coming from Bellefonte passed her. Then it turned on the highway in back of her and drove ahead of her to a point a short distance beyond the Reed home. The driver got out of the car, she said, and walked back to her.

Miss Lyons was quoted as saying that the man wore a brown sweater, and that he didn't say a word during the brief encounter. He struck her in the face with what she believed was his fist, she said. Miss Lyons was taken to the office of a Bellefonte physician and was then taken to the Centre County Hospital where her injuries were treated.

Police, checking upon her story, easily located the scene of the attack by a pool of blood, about two and a half feet in circumference, on the macadam road from the pool, drops of blood extended several hundred feet along the road to the Reed home, where the trail ended on the porch.

The girl informed police that she left her home at Lyontown about 8 o'clock to walk to the home of a friend, Dean Meyer, 19, of Centre Hall, R. D. Meyer, summoned to the hospital Monday night, said that he had been in bed when informed of the attack, and had made plans to meet the girl.

From the nature of the wounds on Miss Lyons' face police are of the opinion that she was not struck by a man's fist, but by some instrument. Miss Reed and Mr. Eckley said the assailant was of short stature, had black hair, wore a brown sweater and brown trousers and was driving a green sedan or coach, which seemed to be a late model.

Police said that apparently no attempt had been made to criminally assault the girl. They reported last night that every angle to the baffling matter is being carefully checked.

The attack is the latest of a long series of such occurrences which have kept Centre and Clinton county residents ill at ease for many months. Beginning last December with a series of purse snatchings in Bellefonte, the attacks, occurring in Lyontown, State College, Howard, and Lock Haven, have gradually become more serious in nature. Two other victims, in addition to Miss Lyons, have required hospital treatment.

Ten of the assaults happened in Bellefonte and vicinity; three in State College; one in Howard, and four in Lock Haven.

receive one hour of parking time no matter how many coins are inserted. Out of a total of fifty-one overtime parking tickets given to motorists, only five were exonerated. However, as the fine amounts to only fifty cents, objections to it are few, but the fine of \$1 for parking overtime in an unmeasured, two-hour stall remains as formerly, it was pointed out.

This week only two slugs or tokens were found in meters and police are checking on several suspects who, if caught, will be fined the maximum under the Ordinance, which is \$50.

It was also stated that several meters were damaged by trucks backing into them, and in each case the parties responsible were compelled to pay for the damage.

Police expressed their appreciation for the cooperation given them by the motoring public.
