Also surviving are two brothers, John and Warren Beck, both of Maple Park, Ill. Mr. Beck was a member of the Rebersburg Evangelical church. Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at the Neff Memorial Chapel, Millheim, followed by services in the Rebersburg Evangelical church, with Rev. R. A. Babcock officiating. Interment was made in the Evangelical cemetery, Rebersburg.

Mrs. Lose had never before caught a 'musky' and reported the task of landing the big fish with an unfamiliar casting rod provided plenty of action and sport. The fish is regarded as being an unusually large specimen.
