Poe Valley Legend a Myth

(Continued from page one) years in our endeavor to bring this story to 1839, when Poe supposed to have been playing around with Helena Hallett.

"None of his biographers mentions the fair Helena, but all tell of his undying devotion to Virginia. The Centre county story is that Poe was unsuccessful in his romance with the mountain girl in 1839, and so returned to Philadelphia and wrote The Raven, which he dedicated to Helena Hallett, of Centre Pennsylvania.

"As it so happens he did not write The Raven in the Old Fort Hotel, Centre county, or in Philadelphia, but in New York City, where it first appeared in the Evening Mirror of January 29, 1839.

"It is really a shame to take the Poe story out of such a lovely park as the Poe Park, where the CCC has made one of the most picturesque playgrounds imaginable.

"The park is extensive and includes an artificial lake, fire tower lookouts and the McConnell Narrows, overlooking Weikert. This narrow mountain road is nothing more than a trail, so narrow you simply do not see how it can support the car, from where if you have time between breath-taking adventures you may see a view of mountains and steep declivities that are truly magnificent.

"The fact that this section of Pennsylvania bears the name of Poe when it is so extremely doubtful that he ever visited the place bearing his name, reminds us of the Poe Shrine in Richmond, Virginia. It is a lovely place, but they frankly admit he never lived there, where today are housed many mementos of his days spent in that city.

"In June, 1840, Poe left New York for a trip to Richmond. He stopped in Philadelphia with John Sartain, the artist and publisher, where Poe exhibited signs of dementia. Three weeks after leaving New York he was found in Richmond, seemingly

well and sane. He was feted by Richmond citizens and a subscription lecture was arranged for him with the proceeds of the lecture (\$1500) Poe started north. He reached Baltimore during an election. Whether he went upon a debauch, or was dragged by a political agent to be used as a "repeater"—both explanations are offered—on the night of Wednesday, October 3 he was taken to a hospital on North Broadway, suffering from "brain fever." He died October 7, 1849, and lies buried beside his aunt and mother-in-law, Mrs. Marie Poe Clemm, in Baltimore.
