CLUB SPEAKER OUTLINES MEASURES FOR HEALTH

"A Program to Defend the Country's Health in Times of War and Peace" was discussed by Dr. A. L. Dayis of the Pennsylvania State College, at a meeting of the Woman's Club in the high school Tuesday evening.

Dr. Davis' program for health fitness included physical, mental, meral and emotional effic-He proposed these measures to defend the health of this country not only in war but in peace: premarital health examinations, clinics for expectant mothers, thorough checkup for all children before entering school and periodically tuberculin tests frequently, tests for sight and hearng in early grades, use of recreation as an antidote for neurotic disorders, placing nutrition on the basis of intelligent use without waste, improved housing and sanitation, positive protection against occupational diseases, better program of sex education, and a rehabilitation program for correcting

physical defects. Dr. Davis stressed the importance of selling the idea that good health pays dividends in peacetime as well as war. He illustrated his lecture by the use of three motion picture reels, "When Bobby Goes to School," "Cancer," and "Tuberculosis."
