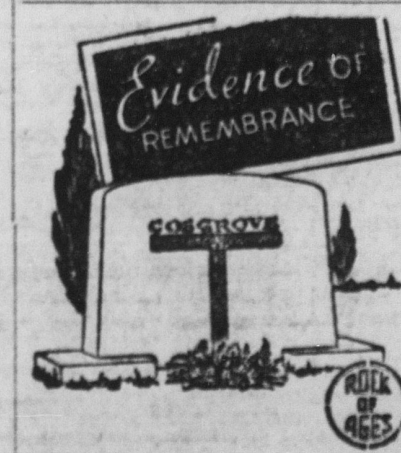
### GEO. WASHINGTON BEIGHTOL

A "traveling library" service available to organizations located in any part of the state has been organized at the Pennsylvania State College.

The plan is designed primarily to give assistance to such groups as women's clubs, debating teams, business organizations, labor groups, defense councils, and young people in communities where local library facilities are inadequate.

Using as its major source the 225,000 volumes in the College's central library, collections have already been assembled by the library staff on approximately 50 subjects of general interest.
