U. S. Declares War On Japan

(Continued from page five)

Japanese bombers had "caused severe damage to American naval and military forces" and that "many American lives had been lost."

(Mr. Roosevelt did not give figures in his address, but the White House had disclosed earlier that the United States had lost two warships and 3,000 dead and wounded.)

But, the president asserted, while Congress again filled the chamber with deafening cheers.

"No matter how long it may take us to overcome this premeditated invasion, the American people in their righteous might will win through to absolute victory."

His speech was brief, but it was pointed. And when it was completed, Congress set about to adopt the resolution declaring war, with every indication that it would be done quickly.

Members of the floor of the House set up shouts of "vote, vote, vote" as soon as Mr. Roosevelt had left the chamber.

All the tumult which followed Mr. Roosevelt's speech was in sharp contrast with the mood in which Congress assembled. There were few smiles and only a subdued hum of conversation.

In the House before the vote Rep. Martin of Massachusetts, the Republican leader, won thunderous applause as he pledged "unqualified support" to the president and expressed the hope that not one vote would be cast against the resolution.

"There can be no peace," Martin shouted, "until the enemy is made to pay in full way for his dastardly deed. Let us show the world we are a united nation."

The President's Message

The text of President Roosevelt's war message to Congress follows:

Yesterday, December 7, 1941—a date which will live in infamy—the United States of America was suddenly and deliberately attacked by naval and air forces of the empire of Japan.

The United States was at peace with that nation and, at the solicitation of its government and its emperor looking toward the maintenance of peace in the Pacific.

Indeed, one hour after Japanese air squadrons had commenced bombing in Oahu, the Japanese ambassador to the United States, and his colleague delivered to the secretary of state a formal reply to a recent American message. While this reply stated that it seemed useless to continue the existing diplomatic negotiations, it contained no threat or hint of war or armed attack.

It will be recorded that the distance of Hawaii from Japan makes it obvious that the attack was deliberately planned many days or even weeks ago. During the intervening time, the Japanese government has deliberately sought to deceive the United States by false statements and expressions of hope for continued peace.

The attack yesterday on the Hawaiian Islands has caused severe damage to American naval and military forces. Very many American lives have been lost. In addition, American ships have been reported torpedoed on the high seas between San Francisco and Honolulu.

Yesterday the Japanese government also launched an attack against Malaya.

SOCIOLOGIST REPORTS ON PENNA. POPULATION TRENDS

Markets for goods which old folks consume may become increasingly active, but the markets for children's toys, clothes, and food should be sluggish.

Fewer schools but more old folks homes will be needed in Pennsylvania. If present population trends continue, the ranks of the aged grew in number about 12 per cent as fast as the total population of the state between the census enumerations of 1930 and 1940.

During this short span of 10 years the number of persons over age 65 was augmented by one-third. In other words, the potential voting strength of the aged became greater, the problems of old age retirement became more important, and markets for the kinds of clothing, food, games and medicines required by old people became larger. These opinions are based by H. R. Cottam, rural sociologist at the Pennsylvania State College, upon changes in the age composition of Pennsylvania's population revealed in preliminary reports of the 1940 census.
