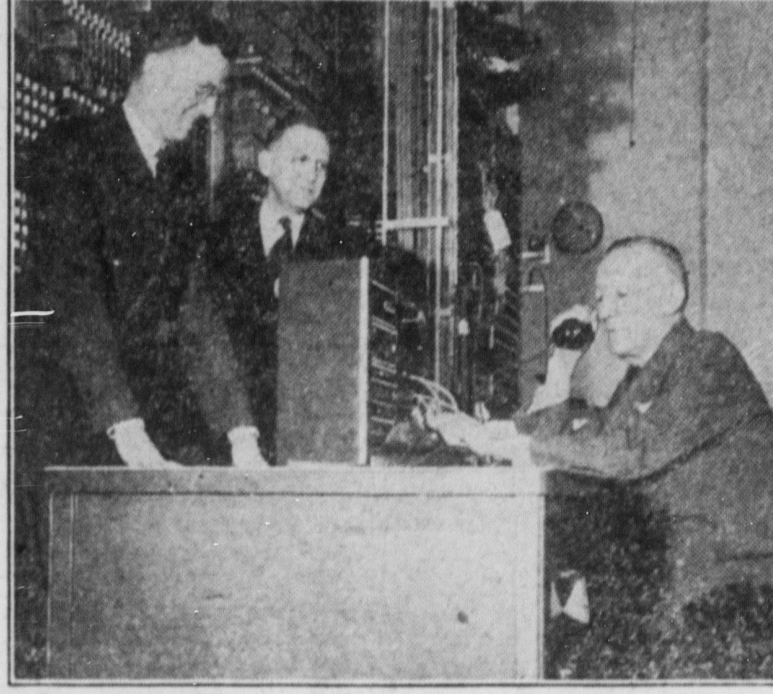

BURGESS ISSUES RED CROSS PROCLAMATION WHEREAS the United States of America is now engaged in a total war to gain a total victory; AND WHEREAS the American National Red Cross has now issued an appeal to the American public to contribute the sum of fifty million dollars to be used for war relief; and whereas this is the first time that the American public has been called upon, since the time of the first World War, to contribute moneys for the relief of our own armed forces and our own citizens; and whereas the Bellefonte Chapter of the American National Red Cross has been assigned a quota of \$7500 as its share in this humanitarian cause.

Salvation Army Launch Appeal

Seek Help of Local Citizens to Provide Christmas Cheer Fund

For over fifty years the Salvation Army has conducted its program of Christmas cheer amongst that class of people it was designed to serve, and it is peculiar that no matter how efficiently communities organize their social welfare activities and no matter how many agencies develop seasonal programs of any kind, the traditional impression of years' standing brings scores of applications to The Salvation Army, and hundreds of families look to that organization for aid.

Use of a three-cent stamp for out-of-town greetings or a two-cent stamp for local cards assures the sender that the card will be returned if it can't be delivered, and if the return address is given, this apparently insignificant factor has been the cause of many broken friendships, Mr. Meek said.

This is the first time a Christmas appeal has been conducted in Bellefonte by the Salvation Army Committee and it has been done with the full consent of the Community Welfare Fund Board of Directors and it is felt that this little extra will not work any hardship. The fund is one of goodwill and free will and only those who feel they would like to give to this charity are encouraged to respond.
