Burns Fatal To Altoona Man

Victim Was Former Prominent Baseball Player. 74 Years Old

Burns suffered in his home December 21 proved fatal to Joseph P. McIntosh, one-time prominent baseball player of Altoona, who died at the Mercy Hospital Friday afternoon. He was 74 years old. Dying of while sitting in front of the kitchen stove, Mr. McIntosh's clothing caught fire and he was severely burned. His wife beat out the flames and he was rushed to the hospital where he remained a patient until his death. Survivors include his wife, six children, a sister and one brother. "Joe" McIntosh was a member of the original Dilliance base ball team as well as one of the organizers, the team performing on what was known as the gas house diamond and at Juniata. He also played professional base ball for Johnstown in the former Tri-State league and for Altoona in the Intra-State league. At various times he performed for Tyrone, Lewistown and Philadelphia teams.

County Suffers Sub-Zero Cold

Although degrees below zero was in the thermometer in the county recorded as much as 14 below. Ten below zero was recorded at State College during the cold wave. Spring Creek, west of Bellefonte, was frozen solid from bank to bank and ice skating came into its own in all parts of the county. McCoy's dam, north of town, has frozen over only two or three times since the new dam was built many years ago, but last Thursday morning the broad expanse of water was frozen from bank to bank. It took until Friday for the cold to penetrate the ground sufficiently to reach water pipes, but when frost did reach that depth it caused plenty of trouble. Plumbers in Bellefonte employed all the extra trained help available in thawing out frozen pipes. One plumber reported that some service lines which had never been known to freeze before, were put out of service by the frigid weather.

Big Population Jump
Berwick's population increased 2,300 persons during 1941, according to figures compiled in connection with a housing survey of the town. It has been announced. The 1940 census figure was 15,470. It is now nearly 18,000 and is still growing, due to the great increase in the working force at the American Car and Foundry Company plant. Berwick is the real boom town of Central Pennsylvania.

Boy Badly Burned
Kenneth Nuss, 12, of near Bloomsburg, suffered serious burns of the hand in an explosion which happened when he and Samuel Fesse were refueling a kerosene stove. Some of the gasoline had been spilled on the stove. Fesse carried the boy from the building and rolled him in the snow, extinguishing the flames except those of the stove, before they reached the flesh.

Head Injury Is Fatal to Youth
Shecker, of Millburg, conducted an investigation into the fatality. Tuesday and ruled that an inquest would not be necessary. He said that from all indications Lynch had fainted and had fallen down the stairway.
