No Free Seeds For Victory Gardeners

The State nor the Federal Government has announced any intention to distribute free vegetable seeds to Victory gardeners, F. Glenn Rogers, chairman of the Centre County Victory Garden Committee, announced today in answer to many inquiries.

In certain localities, charitable or service organizations have undertaken to purchase and distribute seeds and other garden supplies to needy families who have access to suitable land for gardening. When such organizations furnish garden supplies for needy families, Victory Garden Committees stand ready to assist families with information about gardening methods and with as much capable supervision as is volunteered by qualified persons.

Mr. Rogers stated also that the War Production Board has issued orders permitting garden tool manufacturers to produce four per cent more hand garden tools than were produced in the same factories last year. Garden tools, therefore, even though the supply is slightly larger than last year, should be bought with a view toward making them serve as much use as possible.

Ready-mixed complete chemical fertilizers will be sufficient for all expected new or enlarged gardens. Nitrate of soda, popular for scattering on the surface, between rows of crops, is being rationed by fertilizer dealers on the basis both of the supply available for civilian use and the commercial vegetable or fruit crops grown in the locality. Very little if any of this fertilizer will be available for Victory gardeners in most localities.
