SOIL CONDITION FACTOR IN SUCCESSFUL PLANTING

The best time to plant vegetable seeds, according to Chairman F. G. Rogers of the Victory Garden Committee of Centre county, is after rain as soon as the soil is in proper condition to work. The proper soil condition can be tested easily by grasping a handful of soil and compressing it moderately with the fingers. If a ball is formed which may be crumbled readily, the soil is suitable for planting.

FARM CALENDAR

Chicks Want Comfort—Properly ventilated brooder houses help to provide comfort for growing chicks, say poultry specialists at the Pennsylvania State College. The ventilation should be changed according to the needs of the chicks, adjustments sometimes being necessary from three to five times daily.

Be Careful With Lights

When Blackouts are called, everyone must be careful with candles, lamps, and lanterns to prevent fires, warn agricultural engineers of the Pennsylvania State College. Flashlights are safer for moving about, and it is wise to have an extra set of cells and a replacement bulb on hand.

Control Soil Insects

Soil and land weedy ground should be spaded or plowed as soon as it can be worked if it is to be used for gardens. This will help control insects in the ground, remind entomologists at the Pennsylvania State College.

FRUIT GROWERS PREPARE FOR WAR ON INSECTS

Fruit growers are overhauling their sprayers and "guns" and making them ready for the annual war against the insect horde which attacks the orchards of the state. About 400 insects attack apple trees, according to Dr. S. W. Frost, entomologist at the Penn State agricultural experiment station. Fortunately, only about 75 are common and of these only 25 are of economic importance. Nevertheless, they cause annual damage estimated at more than \$13,000,000 in spite of all efforts. In addition, cost of control ranges over \$17,000,000, making a total expense of more than \$30,000,000 each year. The average loss in commercial orchards is around 12 per cent of the fruit crop, and where nothing is done to control insect losses may run as high as 100 per cent.
