TRAINING COURSE FOR CIVILIAN DEFENSE WORKERS

A basic training course for members of fourteen Corps Units of the United States Citizens' Defense Corps will be started July 6, 7:30 p. m., at the Bellefonte Academy building, according to Aaron Leit-zell, Commander, Bellefonte Defense Council.

This training is necessary to comply with requirements established by the Federal Office of Civilian Defense. Corps units required to take all or parts of this training are: Air Raid Wardens, Staff, Messengers, Drivers, Rescue Squads, Auxiliary Firemen, Auxiliary Police, Fire Watchers, Emergency Food and Housing Corps, Medical Corps, Nurses Aides, Road Repair Crews, Demolition and Clearance Crews, and Decontamination Squads.

July 6—Part I—Civilian Defense Organization, Air Raid Warning System, Blackouts.

July 7, 7:00—A repeat session will be held covering Part I.

July 9—Part II—The operation of the Control Center.

July 10, 7:00 p. m.—Part II will be repeated.

July 12—Part III—The Control of Incendiary Bombs.

July 14, 7:00 p. m.—Part III will be repeated.
