Polish Substitute: If you have completely run out of polish, and you simply must polish your silver for company, try using a little of your toothpaste on a soft cloth.

Excessive Perspiration: Excessive perspiration under the arms can be lessened by dissolving one-half teaspoonful of ordinary cooking soda in a small cupful of water and applying. This solution is very cooling.

Frying Eggplant: When frying eggplant, tomatoes, or other vegetables, which are dipped into cracker crumbs, it is extremely difficult to fry the second pan because of the burned crumbs from the first pan.

Black Specks on Silver: The small black specks on silver are caused by the chemical action of salt on the silver. These may be removed by any cream silver polish.

Transplanting: Don't make the mistake of transplanting young plants while the sun is hot and shining. Do this work after sundown; then water them thoroughly.

Mayonnaise: If mayonnaise separates and becomes clotted, try adding the white of an egg, putting it in slowly, half a teaspoon at a time, until the mixture is again smooth.
