Words Often Misused Do not say, "Where have the children gone to?" Omit to. Do not say, "He is the best workman of any man in the shop." Say, "of all the men," or, "among all the men."

Words Often Misspelled Principle (a fundamental truth); principal (highest in importance). Melee, though pronounced may-lay, fatigue, observe the figure, pronounced teej, Bully, ily, pulley, iley. Adhere, ere; career, eer. Wrap (to infold); rap (to strike with a quick blow).

Words Often Mispronounced Mezzanine. Pronounce mez-a-nen, first e as in men, a as in ask, un-stressed, second e as in see, accent first syllable. Flaccid. Pronounce pla-ka-b'l, first a as in play, second a as in ask, un-stressed, accent first syllable. Defamation. Pronounce def-a-ma-shun, e as in met, first a un-stressed, second a as in may, principal accent on third syllable.

Words Often Misspelled Impotence. A lack of power or strength; weakness. (Accent first syllable.) "He who gives himself airs of importance exhibits the credentials of impotence."—Lavater. Insufferable; incapable of being suffered or endured. "What could atone for these insufferable wrongs?"
