Sarah Ann's Cooking Class

A well stocked pantry is still the source of menu ideas. I am sure during these hot summer days the home-makers will welcome these recipes which require a minimum of time and labor. They all came off the pantry shelf.

Stuffed Frankfurters

One No. 1 tall can frankfurters 2 cups freshly mashed potatoes 1 tablespoon butter 3 to 4 tablespoons hot milk 1 egg, well beaten Salt and pepper 1-2 cup grated American cheese Two or three kinds canned vegetables. Butter for vegetables.

Heat but do not boil the frankfurters in the liquid from the can. Add butter and milk to mashed potatoes. Whip until fluffy. Add egg and season with salt and pepper. Split the frankfurters lengthwise without cutting all the way through. Heap the potato mixture on the frankfurters. Sprinkle cheese over top. Place in a baking pan or heating plank that has been brushed lightly with salad oil. Arrange the frankfurters in the center and bake in an oven 450 degrees until the potato is nicely browned. Remove plank and arrange vegetables that have been heated in this new liquor and seasoned with salt and pepper and butter. Whole kernel corn, butter beans and whole beets are a nice combination.

Four-in-One Casserole

1 lb. can roast beef hash 2 cups canned meat sauce or gravy One No. 2 can mixed vegetables 2 cups prepared biscuit mix 2-3 cup water 1-2 cup grated American cheese 2 tablespoons chopped parsley. Break up the roast beef hash with a fork. Mix with the meat sauce or gravy, and the canned drained vegetables. Heat just to boiling. Pour into casserole. Add water to biscuit mix. Stir together with a fork. Roll out in a triangular shape piece about 1-4 inch thick on a floured board. Sprinkle with grated cheese and chopped parsley. Roll up, starting on the long side. Cut into 1-2 inch slices. Arrange these pin wheel biscuits in the casserole on top of the meat and vegetables. Bake in an oven 450 degrees for 15 minutes or until biscuits are nicely browned and the sauce hot.

Vegetable Salad

1 envelope of gelatin 1-4 cup water 1 1-2 cups hot canned orange juice 1-4 cup lemon juice 1-2 teaspoon grated onion Salt Sugar to taste, if desired 1 cup well drained canned vegetables. Sprinkle gelatin over water to soften. Stir in the orange juice and stir until dissolved. Add lemon juice, sugar, onion and salt. Chill until it begins to thicken. Then stir in the vegetables. Pour into small oiled molds and chill. Serve on any greens with mayonnaise.

Devonshire Apricots

1 package cream cheese 1-4 teaspoon grated lemon rind 1-3 cup cream 1 tablespoon lemon juice 1-2 tablespoon sugar Chilled canned apricots. Mash cream cheese, and blend in remaining ingredients. Sauce may be thinned with apricot sauce if desired. Serve 2 or three chilled apricots and some of the syrup in sherbet glasses. Pour the sauce over them.

Cucumbers With Sour Cream

2 medium cucumbers 1 1-2 teaspoons salt 1 cup thick sour cream 2 tablespoons white vinegar 1 tablespoon minced onion Pinch of sugar Pepper. Peel and slice cucumbers and sprinkle with 1 teaspoon salt. Let stand 30 minutes, then press out any excess water between pieces of cheesecloth. Meanwhile combine the remaining ingredients and mix with the cucumbers.
