Parking Meter Fee Held Legal by Court

Judge William G. Barthold in Northumberland county court this week handed down an opinion sustaining the right of the city of Easton to operate parking meters and dismissing the suits of five merchants challenging that right.

Judge Barthold ruled the city has statutory power to use meters as a traffic control regulation, under the Motor Vehicle Code, and has the power to charge a fee.

First Trip Home in 3 Years

Tech. Sgt. Raymond Dunkleberger, son of Mr. and Mrs. A. G. Dunkleberger, East Howard street, Bellefonte, arrived in Bellefonte last Wednesday for a brief visit but was recalled by telegram on Friday and left the same evening by train for San Antonio, Texas, where he expected to take a plane for his designated post.

T-Sgt. Dunkleberger enlisted in the Air Corps in August, 1939, and had been stationed at Panama until January of this year when he was transferred to Salinas, Ecuador, South America. He graduated from a Technical School in Rio Hato and is now crew chief of a bomber squadron.

This was his first visit home in more than three years. Sgt. Dunkleberger's brother, Sgt. Roy Dunkleberger, is at Fort Sill, Okla., and another brother, Guy Dunkleberger, leaves on Tuesday for the induction center.

May Be Overseas



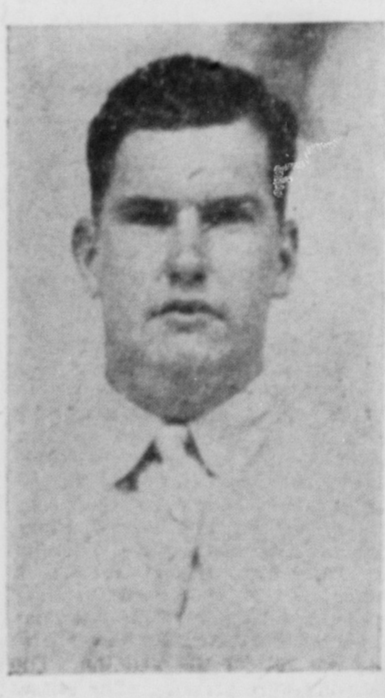

After receiving his basic training at Camp Wheeler, Ga., where he received special recognition with the use of the pistol, rifle and machine gun, he was transferred to the Signal Corps attached to the Air Corps at Drew Field, Florida. He later was sent to Kansas City, Mo., for a three months period of training in the Midland Radio Technical School. After his graduation and award of diploma, he was transferred to Fort Monmouth, N. Roll of Honor Urged for Town

A Roll of Honor—a list of every man from this area who is serving his country in the armed forces—has been suggested for Bellefonte. In many towns and cities the Rolls of Honor, usually erected in the most prominent part of the city, consist of a large wooden frame, on which are inscribed the names of service men.

Such a roll serves a number of worthwhile purposes. It keeps before the public mind the names of those who are fighting our battles in every corner of the earth. It brings home to all the fact that nearly every family is directly or indirectly affected by the call to arms and by the gigantic war in which we are now engaged.

Then, too, such a roll serves to pay some small measure of tribute to those who are going in ever-increasing numbers to the first lines of the nation's defense.

No President

COUNTY SCHOOLS TO GET \$25,567 IN STATE AID

Two hundred ninety-seven second and third class school districts in 50 counties will share nearly \$6,000,000 in regular semi-annual payments of State-aid due this month and approved by Auditor General F. Clair Ross.

Largest single payment, \$679,518, goes to Allegheny county. Luzerne county is second with \$638,100, and Lackawanna third with \$398,100. In Centre county, Bellefonte Borough will receive \$14,822.99, and State College Borough \$10,675.00, or a total of \$25,567.99.
