James Dennison Snyder, 31, of Fort Matilda, a former minister, was sentenced to serve six months in the county jail Monday morning when he pleaded guilty to a charge of adultery, as the September criminal court opened here before Judge Ivan Walker.

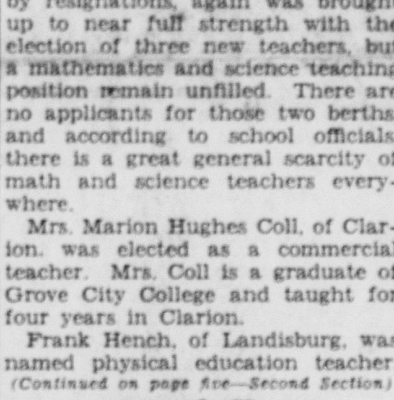

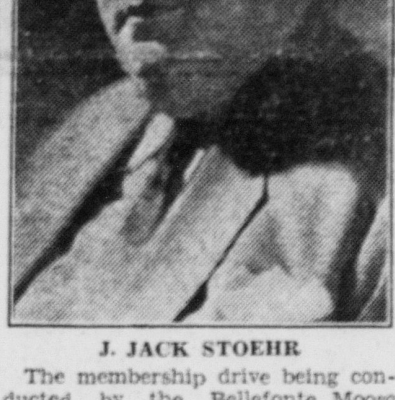
