

County Votes Republican, Martin and Entire GOP State Ticket is Elected

VanZandt Leads Ticket in County; Litke Loses Assembly Seat by Margin of 733 Votes; Letzler Defeats Thompson for Senate; Only 50 Per Cent of Voters Turn Out

Following the State-wide trend, Centre County went solidly Republican in Tuesday's general election and gave GOP candidates majorities ranging from 733 to 2168, according to the unofficial newspaper tabulation of returns.

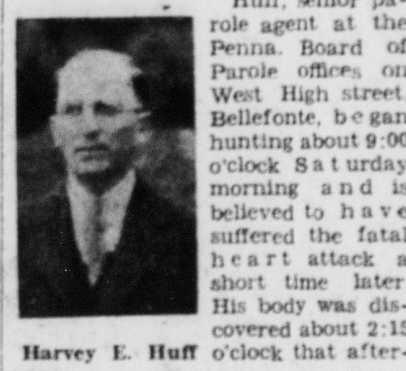

Two Hunters Die; Bodies are Found

John W. Bruss, 78, Unionville, and Harvey E. Huff, 49, Pleasant Gap, Succumb to Heart Attacks While Hunting Small Game

Heart attacks suffered under almost identical circumstances proved fatal to two Centre County hunters during the first few days of the 1942 small game season.

John W. Bruss, 78, of near Unionville, was found dead in a woods not far from his home yesterday morning, and Harvey E. Huff, 49, of Pleasant Gap, was found dead in a wooded section of Green Valley, Saturday afternoon.
