Officers reported that Mike Kushwara, of Bellefonte, saw McGarvey talking with two unidentified men on West High street about 1:30 a. m.

Apparently the accident which resulted in his death happened soon after Kushwara saw him, for at least three persons in the vicinity of the Water and High street intersection heard calls for help shortly after 1:30.

Passersby on the Water street sidewalk, Sunday, ordinarily would not see the body in the stream, for it was close against the wall, and could be seen only by leaning out over the railing and looking straight down.

Pau Hastings McGarvey was a son of John W. and Ella Maines McGarvey and was born in Bellefonte on October 24, 1885.

Deceased was a graduate of the Bellefonte High School and at one time was employed as a surveyor by the State Highway Department.

Rationing Officials Clarify Regulations

Portable coal and oil heating stoves for home heating will be rationed, beginning Friday, in the 30 States now rationed for fuel oil...

The program will make it relatively simple to obtain coal stoves, but very difficult to obtain oil-burning stoves.

Emergency Request The OPA said it was acting under an emergency request received today from the War Production Board.

Primarily eligible for coal heaters will be persons who will use the new stoves to replace oil burning equipment.

Oil Stove Restrictions The portable oil burning stoves will be used only where no one in the household is physically able to operate coal burning equipment.

The WPB has approved production of 250,000 coal burning units monthly.

DELIVERIES: In order that merchants may be better able to handle their last-minute Christmas delivery rush, the Office of Defense Transportation today granted permission for local delivery services to make an additional delivery on Dec. 24.

SUGAR: Persons who eat regularly in the same restaurant or boarding house and who now surrender their sugar ration coupons if they eat 12 or more meals there weekly, will not have to give up the coupons unless they eat at least 14 meals a week in the establishment.

HEARING AIDS: The WPB has standardized the type of battery used for hearing aid devices as an aid toward correcting the serious shortage of batteries for the devices.

CONVENTIONS: The ODT called for abandonment of all conventions and meetings not of major value in winning the war where such conventions involve inter-city travel.

MEAT: To obtain War Ration Book No. 2 for meat and other items that will be rationed in 1943, you must produce Book 1 on date to be announced later.
