**THOMAS PAUL OLSON**  
Thomas Paul Olson, enrolled in the Graduate School at Penn State College, died at 2:25 o'clock Saturday morning, December 12, 1942, of a heart condition at his rooming house at 214 W. College avenue, State College. A resident of Penfield, Clearfield county, Mr. Olson was born August 11, 1914, a son of Carl and Hilda Johnson Olson. The body was taken to Penfield for burial.

**GEORGE PETER**  
George Peter, 81, retired farmer and known throughout Clinton county for his interest in the Grange, died at his home in Beech Creek early Sunday morning of a cerebral hemorrhage. He was stricken Friday evening and never regained consciousness. Born at Rock Cablin, November 24, 1861, he was a son of pioneers in his vicinity. He moved to his own farm when he married in 1892 and had had a prosperous career until the time of his retirement a number of years ago. He had served as assessor for Beech Creek township for 39 years, had been Pomona Master for four years and had served in various offices with the Beech Creek Grange of which he had been a member since 1891. **WILLIAM V. LARIMER**  
William V. Larimer, well known retired liveryman of Bellefonte, died here at 11 o'clock Tuesday night, December 15, 1942, after a lingering illness. He was a son of Gibson and Rachael Furey Larimer and was born on August 26, 1863, making his age at time of death 82 years, 3 months, and 19 days. His wife, the former Marietta Chambers, preceded him in death. Survivors include a son, C. E. Larimer, of Bellefonte. Funeral services will be held at 2:30 o'clock Friday afternoon at the home of the son, C. E. Larimer, on West High street, with the Rev. C. F. Laue, Rockview penitentiary chaplain, officiating. Interment will be made in the Union cemetery. Mr. Larimer, one of the town's few remaining links with an era when the horse was the chief mode of transportation, at one time conducted the Bush House Livery and later the False Livery on West High street, where the Dunlap Motor Company now is located. He kept as high as 29 horses and prided himself upon the fine type of animals he maintained for hire. He was in charge of the stables of the Centre County Fair held for many years on the old

Fair Grounds north of town, and owned several exceptional horses which he exhibited at county fairs and entered in races. From 1917 until his retirement five years ago Mr. Larimer was in charge of the stables at Rockview penitentiary.

Henrietta Lyons, of East Howard street, Bellefonte, died at 10:30 o'clock Monday morning, December 14, 1942, in the Centre County Hospital from complications. ## 4-H Lamb Club Round-up, Sale

Bellefonte R. D. Girl Receives Highest Award at Annual Event

Florence Hartle, of Bellefonte, was awarded the Grand Champion ribbon on her pen of lambs at the annual round-up and sale of the Centre County 4-H Club Tuesday of this week at the Penns Valley Sales Barn at Centre Hall.

The champion pen of three lambs weighed 370 pounds and sold for 17.6 cents a pound. It was purchased by R. W. Bierly of Rebersburg.

Seven other 4-H Lamb Club members exhibited lambs and sold them at the sale, including the Grand Champion pen, the Centre County 4-H Club members sold 25 lambs totaling 2289 pounds, at an average price of 17.6 cents a pound, bringing a total of \$403.78.

The lambs averaged 76 pounds when weighed in September; 101 pounds when weighed at the sale, and made a daily gain of 2 pound per lamb. Mr. D. T. Smithgall, of Williamsport, purchased fifteen of the twenty-five lambs sold. These lambs belonged to the following club members: Dan Stearns, Lemont; Raymond Musser, Bealsburg; Virginia Elms, Warriors Mark; Laura Peters, Stone Mountain; and Dean Luse, Centre Hall.
