Local relatives of Colonel Ralph F. Love last Friday learned from his wife at Ft. Sam Houston, Texas, that Col. Love was lost when his plane crashed on a reef in the Pacific while going in to refuel.

Mrs. Rose Love, of Altoona, who now is visiting with her sister, Mrs. J. C. Gfrerer, at Akemann Well known in the Bellefonte area through visits at the Owens and Gfrerer homes, the missing man is a cousin of Charles and Wilbur Saxton and of Sarah Love, all of Bellefonte.

Colonel Love, aged 49, was a native of Altoona, a graduate of Altoona High School, class of 1914, and is survived by his mother; his wife; a nine-year-old son, Tommy, who is with Mrs. Love at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, and two brothers and a sister: Joseph E. Love, Fred Love and Mrs. Maud Wolf, all of Altoona.

Joining the army early in life he entered the first officers' training camp established in the last war at Fort Niagara, New York, May 13, 1917, interrupting his studies as a member of the junior class at Pennsylvania State College. On August 24, 1918, he became a first lieutenant of infantry and on March 26, 1942, was promoted to colonel.

GOAL OF CAMPAIGN IS SET AT \$600
