### MRS. SARAH BREON MARKLE

Mrs. Sarah Breon Markle died at the home of Mrs. Charles Delong at Centerville, Snyder county, February 16, 1943, at the age of 84 years and 6 months. She was a daughter of George and Katharine Breon and was a native of Georges Valley, Spring Mills. She leaves to survive a son, John; a granddaughter, and a number of nieces and nephews, including Mrs. John Hosterman and Ella Breon, of Millheim. She was a member of the Lutheran church. Mrs. Markle was the last member of a family of 13 children.

### MRS. CLEMENT H. GRAMLEY

Mrs. Elizabeth Rachel Gramley, wife of former Centre County Auditor Clement H. Gramley, of Rebersburg, died at her home there at 3 o'clock Sunday afternoon, February 21, 1943, of complications following a paralytic stroke. She was a daughter of Michael and Hanna Bierly Krape and was born in Clintondale on January 3, 1866, making her age at time of death 77 years, 1 month and 18 days. She is survived by her husband; two sons, S. Charles Gramley, of Flemington, and C. Ralph Gramley, of Forty-Fort; two brothers, Charles L. Krape, of Hubersburg, and Ellery Krape, of Howard; R. D. four grandchildren and one great-grandchild. Mrs. Gramley was a member of the Lutheran church. Funeral services were held at the home yesterday afternoon, followed by services in the Rebersburg Lutheran church, with Rev. Dale L. Kohr, assisted by Rev. Fred Denbeaux, officiating. Interment was made in the Lutheran cemetery, Rebersburg.

### JOHN WILLIAM ORR

John William Orr, of Howard, father of Earl S. Orr, of Bellefonte, died at 10 o'clock Friday night, February 19, 1943, at his home after a six months' illness with a complication of diseases. Until retiring from active life several years ago Mr. Orr had operated a farm in Marion township for many years. He was a former member of the Howard school board and of Marion Grange and the Lick Run Presbyterian church, both of Jacksonville. Mr. Orr was a son of Oliver and Angelina Sigler Orr and was born in Millfin county on January 8, 1862, making his age at time of death 81 years, 1 month and 11 days. On December 23, 1882, he was united in marriage with Martha Agnes Irvin, who survives with the following children in addition to Earl S. Orr, of North Spring street, Bellefonte: Oscar, of Ralston; May, at home; Mary Ellen, both, of Long Beach, Cal.; Mrs. Charles Rabb, of Millersville, and James Walter, of Schofield Barracks, Hawaii. Also surviving is a sister, Mrs. W. W. Orndorf, of Howard. Funeral services were held Monday afternoon at the home in Howard, by Rev. John R. Gulik, pastor of the Howard Reformed church officiating. Interment was in the Lick Run cemetery, Jacksonville.

### SAMUEL COOPER MILLER

Samuel Cooper Miller, retired school administrator in Chester and a native of Centre county, died at his home on South Patterson street, State College, at 11:15 a. m. Monday, February 22, 1943. He was 70. From 1906 until June, 1942, he served in the public schools of the city of Chester. In July of last year, he and Mrs. Miller moved to State College to make their home. Samuel Cooper Miller was born in Ferguson township on September 8, 1872, a son of David W. and Mary Cooper Miller. He was married to Mildred Mandeville, who survives with one son, Russell C., of State College, and one daughter, Mrs. Garnet C. McCartney, of Helen Mine, Sault St. Marie, Ontario, Can. He also leaves one brother, John G., of Pine Grove Mills, and three grandchildren. He was a member of the State College Presbyterian church and a former member of the Third Presbyterian church of Chester, where he was an elder for 20 years. He belonged to Penn Lodge No. 709, F. and A. M., of Chester, Chester Commandery No. 66, Knights Templar; Chester Chapter No. 258 R. A. M.; Benjamin Franklin Consistory of Philadelphia, and Pine Grove Mills I. O. O. F. Funeral services will be held at 2 p. m. Thursday at the Koch funeral home, State College, in charge of Rev. E. H. Jones, with interment at Pine Grove Mills.

### MRS. MARIE LUPTON

Mrs. Marie Lupton, widow of the late Marie Lupton, of Phillipsburg, died at the Centre County Home here at 7:30 o'clock Monday evening, February 22, 1943. Mrs. Lupton was aged about 80 years and was born in England. There are no survivors in the immediate family. The body was taken to Phillipsburg for interment.

### JOHN KRAPE

John Krape, well known resident of Howard, died at 12:45 o'clock yesterday afternoon, February 24, 1943, at the home of his brother, Harry Krape, in Howard, where he had made his home for some time. Mr. Krape for many years employed in the rolling mill at Howard, was 84 years old. His wife died a number of years ago. Survivors include two daughters, and two brothers, Harry, of Howard, and William, of Lock Haven. Funeral services will be held at the Neff Funeral Home in Howard at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon, and interment will be made in the Schenck cemetery at Howard.

Jacob Coover, former well known State College auctioneer and upholsterer, died at 3:45 o'clock Sunday morning, February 21, 1943, at the Centre County Home, Bellefonte, where he had been a guest since January 10, 1940. He was a son of Stephen and Mary Ann Vance Coover and was born in Cumberland county on April 21, 1861, making his age at time of death 81 years, 10 months. He is survived by his wife, who resides with a daughter, Mrs. Ella Pettinger, at Carlisle, and these other children: John, State College; William and Merrill, both of Carlisle; Ray, of Pittsburgh, and Anna. The body was taken to Carlisle for interment.

### CAPT. JOHN T. SHAFER

Capt. John Thompson Shaffer, M. C., son of the late Dr. O. H. Shaffer, one-time chief of staff of the Altoona Hospital, died suddenly Sunday at the U. S. army base at Kelley Field, Mich. Dr. Shaffer was born in Altoona in 1894, and formerly resided at 1216 Twelfth avenue. He was graduated from the University of Pennsylvania in 1929, and following graduation practiced in Philadelphia. He left Altoona in 1918. Before entering the army last summer, Dr. Shaffer practiced medicine at Sellersville, Pa. His mother, Dr. Mary Thompson, a native of Lemont, was the first pathologist at Altoona Hospital. His father, Dr. O. H. Shaffer, died some years ago. He was born October 6, 1904 in Altoona. Funeral services were held at the Koch funeral home, State College, Wednesday afternoon, with interment in the Branch cemetery.

Mrs. Esther Lillian Faust, wife of William Faust, of Peters Mills, died Monday night, February 23, 1943, in a Harrisburg hospital where she had been a patient for the past several years. Readdy, of Clifton Forge, Va. Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock Friday afternoon at the Goodhart funeral home, Centre Hall, with the Rev. C. M. Hammond, pastor of the Methodist church at Centre Hall officiating. Interment will be made in the Sprucetown cemetery.

### JOHN C. WILSON

John Coop Wilson, 85, a resident of Salona for the past 38 years, died at his home at 3:40 o'clock Tuesday morning after an illness of five years. Funeral services will be held from his residence Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock, in charge of the Rev. John R. Sanderson, pastor of the Salona Methodist church, of which Mr. Wilson was a member. Friends may call at the home tomorrow evening from 7 to 9 o'clock. Burial will be made in Cedar Hill cemetery. Mr. Wilson was born in Millifinburg, the son of the late Mr. and Mrs. O. Perry Wilson, who removed to Clinton county when their son was five years old. For a number of years he was a salesman for the McCormick Harvester Company, later representing an advertising and novelty concern. His survivors include two sons and two daughters, O. Perry, James B., and Miss Mary, at home; Mrs. Josephine Wilson, Williamsport; and two sisters, Mrs. J. D. Allison, Roaring Springs, and Mrs. H. C. Myers, Bellwood.
