MORE MILK FOR FOOD IF CALVES GET LESS

More milk is needed for food this year. A substantial increase in the supply can be made by raising calves according to a method which uses only a small amount of milk to get them started.

County Agent R. C. Blaney says that the method which uses calf starters or dry mixes has become popular in recent years. Dairy men who have adopted this method use only 400 to 500 pounds of milk per calf instead of the 700 to 800 pounds of milk used by other dairy men in starting their calves.

"Success comes in getting the calf to eat the starter as soon as possible while holding the milk at a minimum amount. For the first week after weaning, the calf gets 1 1/2 to 2 quarts of milk twice a day. The second week the ration is 2 to 2 1/2 quarts twice a day. When the calf is one week of age, the dairyman teaches the calf the taste of the starter by putting some in its mouth or letting it take the feed off the ends of the dairyman's fingers. When a taste for the starter has been acquired, the feed should be kept in front of the calf at all times as much as the calf will clean up until it is 5 pounds a day are eaten. This amount is continued until the calf is 3 to 4 months of age. At seven weeks of age, milk may be gradually eliminated and the calf then will be entirely on dry starter, hay, and water."

CHILD NEEDS PARENTS CONFIDENCE AND HELP

Recent changes in your child's conduct may be due to increased tension caused by wartime conditions. If parents recognize this, they can do much to help their child. Miss Helen S. Butler, home economics extension representative of Centre county, says:

"Here are some things that you may notice in your child: he is more restless than usual, he may bite his nails or twist his hair, he is easily upset, he finds it hard to get to sleep and he is extremely intolerant. He may not want to be away from his parents, and he may be naughty."

"It is obvious that punishing a child to overcome these things will tend to make the situation worse rather than better. Instead, parents are called upon to be calm, tolerant, understanding, and show self-control."

"First try to determine the cause of the child's anxiety. This cannot be done by asking the child what is wrong with him, for he does not know. You must observe the child and the conditions surrounding him to decide what is the trouble. When the trouble is discovered, do all you can to eliminate it. A child needs reassurance, love and understanding. Showing a child that adults are sympathetic, that they are interested in him and his difficulties, gives him confidence and courage."

"The present unsettled conditions cause the release of added emotional energy in a child which must be used. One outlet for this excess energy is for parents to provide useful and desirable activities for the child."

HOMEMAKER CANT SELL CANNED GOODS

It is illegal for a homemaker to sell home canned foods to a neighbor or friend under the home rationing system unless the home canner is licensed to do that. Senator Gillette (D-Ia.) was advised.

"The can has been asked by a farm woman if she could sell her home canned foods to my friends in town that are not able to can anything for themselves and don't know how to can anyway."

"When home canned processed foods are sold, they cease to be considered as home canned processed foods. Points must be given up for their transfer. Unless the person who has produced the home canned processed is registered as a processor, he has no authority to sell them or to receive points for such a sale."

INCREASE MEAT SUPPLY BY SAVING LITTLE PIGS

Every little pig saved this spring represents a potential addition of 225 pounds or more to the meat supply. In other words, every little pig that is not sent to the slaughterhouse this year will reduce the possible meat supply by the same amount, County Agent R. C. Blaney points out.

Approximately 60 per cent of the pigs farrowed in the United States are born in the months of March, April and May. That means that the farmers are now entering one of the best periods as far as pork production is concerned. Normally, about one-fourth of all pigs born die before they are three days old, while one-third die before weaning time. A big proportion of this loss could be saved by proper care and attention at farrowing time.

The critical need for an increased supply of pork makes it imperative that every possible effort be made this year to save as many pigs as possible. The marked increase in the number of brood sows in Pennsylvania as compared with the number kept in recent years indicates that many farmers who have not had brood sows for many years will have sows to farrow this spring.
