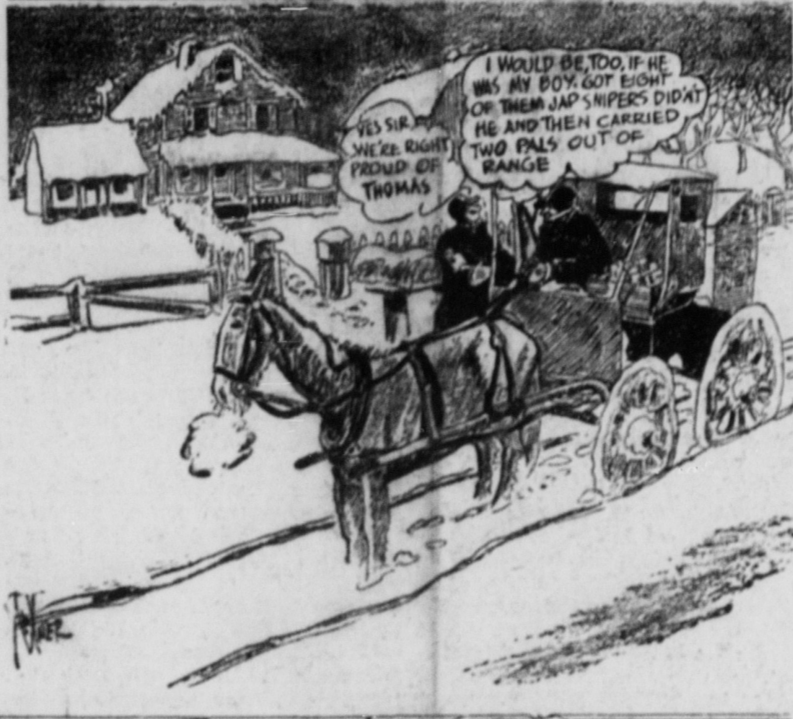

FARM QUESTION BOX by ED W. MITCHELL, Farm Advisor, General Electric Station WGT

Q. What would be a good green feed for pullets? A. Try to get a succession of several things, depending on when you can sow them. Start with oats and millet, then tap off with rye. If you can get a good pasture sod with some clover in it, that is always good.
