had no inquiries from them." For the present, the plant which is being installed in a new brick building on the prison grounds, is under the management of the prison authorities, although Worcester said its operation eventually may be taken over by the prison labor division of the State Department of Welfare. He added present plans call for operating it 200 days each year and that crops grown this year are being stored at institutions until the


