MRS. MARY SAUCERMAN

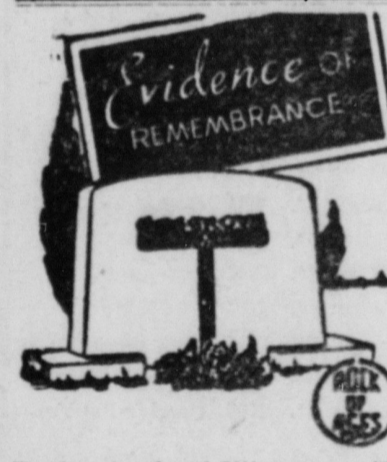

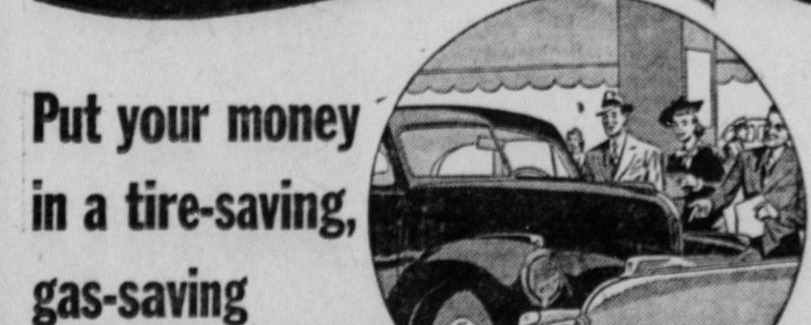
