Sunday School Lesson

THE BIBLE AND ABSTINENCE. International Sunday School Lesson for October 31, 1943. GOLDEN TEXT: "Beware I pray thee, and drink no wine nor strong drink."—Judges 13: 4.

While our scripture from Leviticus does not give the entire story concerning the sin of Nadab and Abihu, sons of Aaron, a reading of the preceding chapter tells us that these young men were assisting their father in the tabernacle with the burning of the offerings for the people.

Their unholy act led to a law which was to last forever. "Drink no wine nor strong drink, thou nor thy sons with thee, when ye go into the tent of meeting, that ye die not: it shall be a statute forever throughout your generations; and that ye make a distinction between the holy and the common, and between the unclean and the clean; and that ye may teach the children of Israel all the statutes which Jehovah hath spoken unto them by Moses."

To Vote a Straight Party Ticket, Mark a Cross (X) in the Square, in the Party Column, Opposite the Name of the Party of Your Choice. A Cross Mark in the Square Opposite the Name of Any Candidate Indicates a Vote for That Candidate. To Vote for a Person whose Name is Not on the Ballot, Write or Paste His or Her Name in the Blank Space Provided for That Purpose. This Shall Count as a Vote Without the Cross Mark. To Vote for an Individual Candidate of Another Party after Making a Mark in the Party Square, Mark a Cross (X) Opposite His or Her Name. For an Office where More than One Candidate is to be Elected, the Voter, after Marking in the Party Square, may divide His or Her Vote by Marking a Cross (X) to the Right of Each Candidate for whom He or She desires to vote. For such Office Votes Shall Not be Counted for Candidates Not Individually Marked. If you Make a Mistake, Do Not Erase, Ask for a New Ballot. Use Only Pencil or Indelible Pencil.
