

Chickens Can't Support Worms, Too
 Intestinal roundworms work fast, completing a full life cycle in 28 days, and the danger of new tapeworm infestation is not over until the snow flies. It is hard to keep chickens free of these parasites because the flock may be ranging on contaminated soil.

Worm infested layers may start egg production, having just enough energy to continue laying until their reserve strength has been drained by the pressure of production, and then they may break down. Chickens simply cannot stand heavy egg production when they are called upon to maintain a heavy worm infestation in addition to their own body requirements.

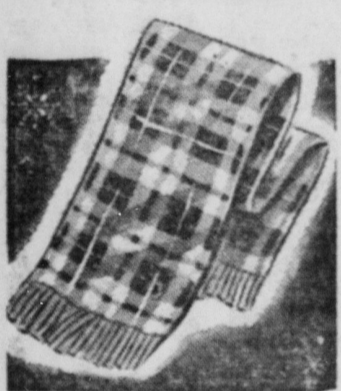
