Sunday School Lesson

CHRIST THE FULFILLMENT OF THE LAW

International Sunday School Lesson for December 19, 1943.

GOLDEN TEXT: "God hath at the end of these days spoken unto us in his Son."—Hebrews 1: 1, 2.

(Lesson Text: Hebrews 1: 1-9; Romans 10: 4-10).

God's Son, is the heir of all things. The whole world is his, for through him it was created. He is also superior to the angels of Heaven...

Then, Paul, in writing to the Romans, declares that Jesus is the saviour of men. In the tenth chapter of this letter, Paul attempts to make clear the difference between the old Jewish idea of how people were saved...

All that is necessary for salvation is, as Paul declares, in Romans 10: 9-10: "If thou shalt confess with thy mouth the Lord Jesus, and shalt believe in thine heart that God hath raised him from the dead, thou shalt be saved."

What follows acceptance of Jesus as one's Saviour? Surely, a true believer will want to try to live as nearly as possible like Jesus lived. We do not intimate that anyone can live a sinless life, but we do say that if one tries honestly and sincerely, he or she will be able to live a better life with Jesus than without him.

God helps us to improve under the leadership of the Holy Spirit. Each improvement—the next step toward the perfection of Jesus Christ. Even the best person, therefore, has something to urge him forward.

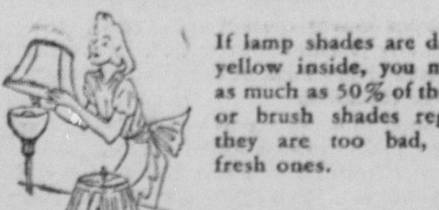
