\$1500 Damage In Fire At College

Damage estimated at over \$1500 was caused by a fire at the home occupied by the E. D. James family at 228 South Atherton street, State College, about 8 p. m. Friday.

The fire is believed to have started in a third-floor bedroom of the house, which is owned by Mrs. Elizabeth Lutz, former State College resident.

The third floor of the building was badly gutted by the fire, which also burned a large hole in the roof. Firemen said that the entire upper part of the house was severely damaged, while some water damage was reported in the lower floors. Firemen placed canvas over most of the furniture in the lower floors to prevent further damage.

The fire was discovered by Mr. James, a campus patrolman, who turned in an alarm at 7:37 p. m. The Alpha Fire Company answered the call and fought the blaze for an hour and a half before it was definitely extinguished. Streams of water from hose lines were played on the outside of the house while booster tanks were used to put out the flames within the house.

L. R. Cole Named to West Penn Post

Following the resignation of R. H. Lightner, who has been industrial sales manager for the Keystone Division of West Penn Power Company, the appointment of L. R. Cole of Pittsburgh as division sales manager, was announced by James E. Pipe, manager of the Keystone Division.

Mr. Cole's appointment will become effective January 1, 1944. He will assume the industrial sales responsibilities formerly handled by Mr. Lightner, and, in addition, will coordinate and direct all other sales promotion activities in the Keystone Division.

In accepting the resignation of Mr. Lightner, P. H. Powers, vice president of the company, stated: "In view of Mr. Lightner's long and productive service with the company we have accepted his resignation with great regret, but with the company's best wishes for his future success."

Mr. Cole entered the employ of West Penn in August 1928 as a service man in the meter department. His later experience has been in the field of sales engineering and promotion in the commercial and industrial customers department in the Pittsburgh office. He is a member of the Illuminating Engineering Society and the Pennsylvania Electric Association, having served on many committees of the latter group. He is married and has two sons.

Meek Resigns As Postmaster Here

 ment agencies located here in recent years dispatch large amounts of "free" mail, for the handling of which the local postoffice receives no credit insofar as gross sales are concerned.

Mr. Meek estimates that the volume of mail handled at the office here has doubled since he first assumed his duties as postmaster. The office reached a first class postoffice rating on May 15, 1942, and according to Mr. Meek the volume of business now being handled virtually assures the town that the office will remain in that classification.

The procedure for naming Mr. Meek's successor is outlined as follows: Since the local Congressman, who normally would handle Federal patronage here, is of different political faith than the national administration, patronage goes to the United States Senator, Joseph P. Guffey, Democrat.

Senator Guffey, presumably, will recommend a successor to Mr. Meek to the Postmaster General, who in turn will notify the President. The President sends the nomination to the Senate for confirmation or rejection.

Another alternative would be for the department to name an Acting Postmaster to serve until such time as a permanent appointment could be made.

It is reported that there are three or four applicants for the forthcoming vacancy.
