The farm machinery situation is critical-many of the machines now in use will have to last for the duration. Most farmers have the time to repair their farm machines during the winter months-but are handicapped because (1) few farmers have a warm, well lighted shop where they can work in comfort. (2) Tools are scarce and expensive and many farm machinery repairs. (3) Many farmers feel they do not understand machines well enough to tear them down in the absence of a skilled in-
