Among the major county jobs for which no appointments have been made at this time are: Chief Assessor—to take charge of tax assessment on a county-wide basis; County Investigator, to conduct investigations on applications for admission to the county home and for other work of a similar nature; and Sealer of Weights and Measures.

How Liquid Fertilizer Can Be Made For setting plants with liquid fertilizer, H. R. Niswonger, extension horticulturist of North Carolina State college, recommends the following procedure: Place one pound of 4-8-4 or 4-10-6 commercial fertilizer in a pail and add enough water to dissolve the fertilizer. Stir thoroughly until the ingredients are completely dissolved. Pour the liquid into a larger container and add enough water to make 10-gallons. Use one pint for each plant when setting in the field. This is in addition to the fertilizer applied in the row.

Mountainous Spanish Morocco Except for the flat rim of the coastal area—broader and more fertile on the Atlantic side than on the Mediterranean—Spanish Morocco is mountainous. Most famous natural feature is the rocky promontory forming one of the Pillars of Hercules on the southern side of the Strait of Gibraltar. Legend has it that this promontory and Gibraltar were joined and that Hercules split them to give access to the ocean beyond. Sandy wastes, common in French Morocco, do not occur on Spain's Moroccan foothold.

Iron and Phosphate Mines Bone, Third among Algeria's ports and a French naval base, Bone, (Bona) is a typical French seaport of 85,000 people. Sixty miles west of the Tunisia frontier, 270 miles east of Algiers, its modern development dates from 1833, when it passed from Arab to French control. Iron and phosphate mines stimulated improvement of the harbor. As Hippo Regius, Bone flourished in the Roman Empire.
