

Echoes From the Past

Fifty Years Ago

On account of snallport at Tyrone... the Pennsylvania Railroad Company has discontinued the sale of tickets to that point until further notice...

Today the Central Railroad of Pennsylvania will extend an excursion over the road to the members of the Bellefonte Board of Trade. The special will leave Bellefonte at 1 o'clock and will begin the return trip immediately upon arrival at Mill Hill.

On Thursday of last week Mr. Harvey Royer, of Zion, was appointed to carry the mails from that place to the station of the Central Railroad, a distance of about one-half mile. There were five applicants for the position, and "Pat" as he is familiarly known, won the race. The new road will begin to carry mail next Monday.

On Monday evening at about 5 o'clock William Green, for many years past held the position of porter at the Brockert House, died from the effects of a contracted smallpox. Mr. Green was one of the oldest colored citizens of Bellefonte. He was an old soldier, having served as a member of Company K, United States Infantry. The interment will take place this Thursday afternoon.

The Central Pennsylvania Railroad paid over \$7,000 to employes on its line from Bellefonte to Mill Hill on Thursday of last week. This amount was the last installment of money for constructing the road. The road is now in good condition and all trains are running regularly on schedule time. Freight and passenger traffic is picking up daily and the promoters of the road are very much encouraged with the business so far.

At the conclusion of a regular meeting of Bellefonte borough council, Councilman John Miller has announced that as the last meeting of the present council for the year, and from the fact that two members, president George L. Potter and Nicholas Bauer, would retire from the body as their terms expired, the closing event would be observed in a more formal way. He wanted all to proceed to Oeder's restaurant where an elaborate spread was awaiting them. Fourteen persons sat at the banquet table. They were Councilmen S. H. Williams, president, George L. Potter, C. T. Gerberich, Al S. Garman, W. T. Hildebrand, John C. Miller, Dr. R. L. Dart, also present, and Secretary of council, and C. M. Dale, Esq., borough solicitor. The press of the town was represented by J. A. Felder, of the Gazette; C. L. Gates, of the Daily News; George Meek, of the Watchman, and Charles R. Kurtz, of the Centre Democrat.

The second floor apartment in the Parrish building was to be occupied by Mr. Parrish who had sold, his dwelling on East Courtin street to W. P. Sieg.

The Bellefonte Fuel and Supply Company coal yards, the J. L. Montgomery residence on North Allegheny street, and the Presbyterian manse on Spring street, involving real estate worth \$69,000, were sold. The Fuel and Supply Company was sold to David Chambers and his daughter, Verma, of Snow Shoe, for about \$45,000. The residence on Allegheny street was purchased by the Presbyterian church for a sum said not to exceed \$12,000.

Boy Schaeffer, Penns Valley huckster, received summons from the Philadelphia police department to appear in that city to answer a charge of parking his car in an illegal manner in that city.
