URGES GREATER SAVING OF PAPER

Need For Waste Paper Grows Steadily, County Chairman Warns

The importance of saving waste paper for use in the war was pointed out this week by members of the salvage committee of Centre county. Paper has been classified as the No. 1 critical material for the prosecution of the war, it was pointed out by R. J. Kennard of State College, chairman of the salvage and waste committee.

Waste paper is so classified because containers are made from the salvaged material, millions of cartons, corrugated and cardboard boxes are necessary for packing overseas military supplies essential to far-flung military fronts. Paper mills are working part time or are shut down entirely because of short supplies of waste paper. In stressing the importance of this salvage material, the committee made the following statement:

Dirt and dust were blown from the radiators with the air hose. Fuel and oil lines and filters were completely cleaned. New spark plugs and gaskets were installed. Valves were tightened and adjusted for proper reclearance. Ignition systems and timing were carefully checked to insure that the tractors were operating perfectly when they left the garage. In addition to this standard procedure, the following special jobs were completed on different tractors:
