The large frame dwelling on East Linn street owned and occupied by Charles Morris and family was sold to Robert Walker, who expected to move there from the Charles Schad property on the same street. D. M. Kline had purchased the Schad house. The Morris home formerly was the Judge Ellis L. Rouse residence.

At a dinner marking the close of the Centre County Hospital campaign for funds, it was announced that pledges and cash totaled \$76,384.80, with two divisions, one the Snow Shoe area and the other the State College region, still unreported. It was estimated that when all reports were filed, the total subscriptions would exceed \$100,000.

Miss Catherine Bradford, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Bradford, of Centre Hall, a registered nurse in the Pittsburgh area, was admitted to the Centre County Hospital to undergo an operation for appendicitis.

Frank Mott, 38, of Madera, Pa., employed by the Sylvania Company, suffered severe injuries of one leg when a bar on a coal machine struck him. Miss Mary Musser resigned as assistant in the dental office of Dr. J. J. Kilpatrick, and Miss Elizabeth Saylor, who had been employed in the office of the United Telephone Miss Grace Sussman, who had been collector for the telephone company, was to take the post vacated by Miss Saylor. Miss Mona Struble had been named collector for the telephone company.

Residents of Nittany were aroused from their sleep late one night by the sound of an explosion, followed by the glare of a flaming cross which had been erected on the Diamond of that town. No one was near the cross when it first appeared. As soon as the flames died out a second cross was found burning in another section of the community. Whether the display was the work of a secret organization or whether it was a prank of boys could not be ascertained.

Among the successful "first day" fishermen in this locality were: William Garman, of Runville, who caught the limit; William Peters, 11; James Caldwell, 12; Paty Bathurst, 17; Charles Martin, 24; and Matthew Wagner, 3. The largest trout reported was a 28-inch one caught by James Fox, of the Parrish drug store. Six anglers were arrested by Game Protector Thomas Mosler, of Bellefonte, for fishing before the season officially opened. County Treasurer J. O. Heverly had issued a total of 1548 licenses.

Struck by a Pennsylvania train, Mrs. Harry Haines, of Canton, Ohio, daughter of George Weaver, of Bellefonte, was in an Ohio hospital suffering from a fractured leg and severe lacerations about the head and shoulders. She had been unconscious since the accident and her condition was reported to be serious. Mrs. Haines was believed to have attempted to cross a street through which the railroad tracks passed, when she was struck by a train. The crossing flagman discovered her body after the train had passed.

Two men were killed in a bad cave-in at the Goss mine at Morgan Run, near Clarence, on Monday morning. Thirty tons of roof rock and dirt fell down, completely burying Patrick and Nicholas Luciano, brothers employed as clay miners. All hands turned in at once to rescue efforts and the Phillipsburg State Hospital ambulance and Drs. E. L. Jones and A. L. Benson were summoned for emergency service.

When miners reached the two they were found to be beyond all aid, having been badly crushed. Luciano was 24 years old and was survived by a wife and child. Patrick was 18 and was unmarried. Evan Evock, ten-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Evock, of Collins' Row, near Bellefonte, was in the Centre County Hospital undergoing treatment for severe injuries received when he was struck by an automobile. The youth was engaged in rolling a hoop near the milk plant on Thomas street when he ran into the path of a car driven by Mrs. Harry Thompson, of Coleville. Witnesses said Mrs. Thompson was traveling at a reasonable speed and sounded the horn of her car when she saw the boy ahead. Just as the machine neared him, it was said, the youth made a sudden turn directly into the path of the car.

Sunday School Lesson

PAUL, THE MISSIONARY International Sunday School Lesson for April 23, 1944.

GOLDEN TEXT: "The Holy Spirit said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work hereunto I have called them."—Acts 13: 2.

Lesson Text: Acts 13: 1-4; 14: 8-20.

Antioch, in Syria, is famous in religious history, and famous it should be, particularly to Christians of the Western World. Here it was that the Gospel was first preached to Gentiles, as well as to Jews, and here it was also, that believers were first called Christians. Our lesson for this week gives us another reason to re-member Antioch. For it was this group of early believers who sent out the first organized missionary enterprise, which resulted in the Gospel being carried westward, eventually reaching us.

The new faith had been proclaimed to individual Gentiles prior to this. Philip preached to the Samaritans and baptized an Ethiopian. Peter had received the centurion, Cornelius, and his household into the faith. Unnamed Christians, scattered by the persecution in Jerusalem, had also preached the gospel to the Gentiles. These were occasional happenings, however, but of purpose, organized missionary enterprise.

Dr. W. M. Smith gives seven characteristics which belonged to the church at Antioch and should characterize every true group of Christian people who gather together for worship and for the hearing of God's word. (1) The membership of the church is made up of those who have turned from unrighteousness and idols to believe in the true and living God.

(2) These members have been brought into the knowledge of the truth by the preaching of the Word, which is the preaching of the Lord Jesus Christ.

(3) The converts of this church received adequate instruction in the truths of the Christian faith at the hands of one who had gifts for teaching and had a real knowledge of the Word of God.

(4) The church, in its life, shows unmistakable signs of being a body of believers on whom the blessing and power of God rests.

(5) The church shows itself to be in life, in conduct, in belief, identical with the other true churches of the known world, and is in fellowship with the churches of the world.

(6) The church is distinctly liberal in its attitude toward other fellow-believers who are suffering because of peculiar circumstances.

(7) The members of this church, in the midst of a corrupt environment, were living such unique, unworldly, holy lives that they were marked out by all the other citizens.
