Formal luncheon was Claude G. Aikens, of State College, chairman of the War Finance Committee. He introduced guests Ogden Nash, Frank Gersavi, Edna Ferber and Vincent McHugh, who responded with informal talks. The four writers were heard in a more extended program at the auditorium, with Mr. Nash as master of ceremonies.

Before and after the luncheon and rally, many persons met the visiting authors and a number of them brought books written by the respective writers to be autographed. Among Ogden Nash's better known works are "The Face is Familiar," "I Am a Stranger Here Myself," and "The Primrose Path." He also is co-author of the Broadway hit, "One Touch of Venus," and is at present co-starting with Guy Lombardo on the radio every Monday night.

Miss Ferber is one of the nation's most popular and beloved story tellers and is best remembered for her books: "So Big," "Cimarron," "Show Boat," and "Saratoga Trunk." Many of her works have been made into plays and movies.

Mr. Gersavi is an ace news correspondent, world traveler and war reporter. He has spoken with many of the national and military leaders of allied and fascist nations, has been on the Italian front, at Naples, Cassino and the Anzio beachhead. He has two books about the war: "War Has Seven Faces," and "But Soldiers Wondered Why." In 1939 he joined Colliers Magazine and has written more than a score of articles for that magazine.

Vincent McHugh is best known for his books "Touch Me Not," "Sing Before Breakfast," "Caleb Gatum's America," and "I Am Thinking of My Darling." He is now writing short non-fiction reviews for the New Yorker and is teaching a seminar on the technique of the novel at New York University.

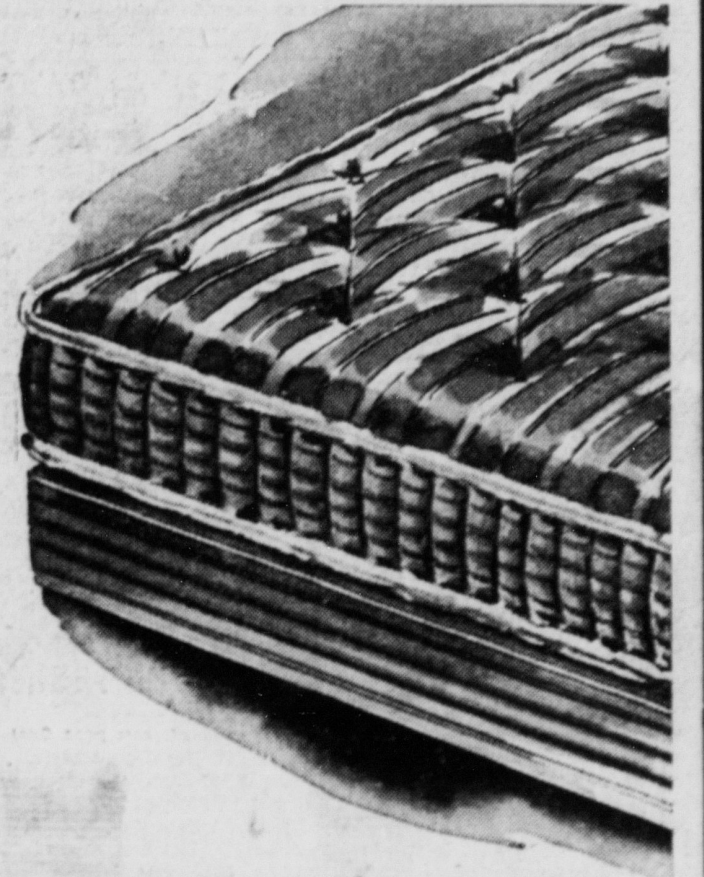
