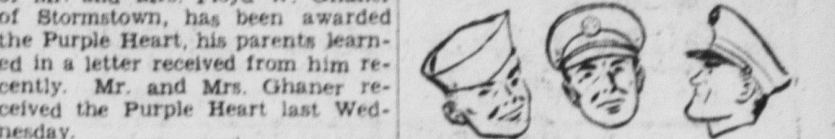
Training at Keesler Field
