Pvt. John S. Edwards, Jr., a trainee at the Cavalry Replacement camp, Fort Riley, Kansas, died on Monday, according to word received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John S. Edwards, Heart trouble was attributed as the cause of his death.
He was inducted into the army December 28, 1943, at Harrisburg. Born at Morrisdale, May 27, 1906, he was aged 38 years. At the age of two and a half years his parents moved to Philipsburg, where Mr. Edwards became proprietor of a shoe establishment.
