Lt. Johnson's squadron struck at gun positions, blockhouses, and supply depots on Jap-held Wotje, Jaluit, and Malaplap islands. He is credited with destroying a supply warehouse at Wotje in addition to scoring damaging hits on blockhouses and radio stations there.

Head of Jap Black Dragon Society Dies

Japan's Dantai (news) agency announced the death of Mitsuo Yamada, 90-year-old head of the Black Dragon Society, Japanese terrorist organization. The dispatch said the "saint" of the terrorist movement died at his summer home of a long illness. FCC Far Eastern monitors described him as "one of the most powerful political bosses in Japan, believed to be the power behind the Tojo government and responsible for the present Greater East Asia war."

FIELD MARSHAL ROMMEL NOW REPORTED BLINDED

Rommel, variously reported as seriously injured or killed in France, was said in a Stockholm dispatch to have been blinded as a result of head injuries. The dispatch quoted a report in the Stockholm newspaper Tidningen which said that Rommel was injured in the Caen area and that it was doubtful whether an operation would save his sight.

TO RESTORE DAMAGED MEMORIALS IN FRANCE

Pennsylvania World War I monuments in France, damaged in the present conflict, will be restored by the commonwealth, after the war, Governor Martin announced. Martin said the main Pennsylvania monument at Verdennes escaped injury but that the memorial bridge at Fismes was badly damaged.
