"BASIC MEAT LOAF"

We Like To Use: 1 cup undiluted White House evap. milk. 1 Cup quick-cooking oatmeal 1/2 pounds chopped raw meat 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/4 teaspoon pepper 1 onion, minced

Scald milk and pour over oatmeal. Let stand until cool. Add remaining ingredients and mix thoroughly. Shape into a loaf and place in shallow baking pan or press into loaf pan about 9x4x3 inches. Bake in moderate oven, 350 degrees F. for 1 1/2 hours. This makes eight servings. —August Women's Day.
