7. What is the correct way to eat canapés?

8. Should the host escort a woman to her home if she has been a guest for an evening?

9. Is there any instance where it is obligatory to introduce two persons?

10. Is it proper to speak to a man, or of a man, by using his last name only, such as "Good morning, Smith," or, "I saw Smith last night"?

11. Should a girl thank a man if he helps her on with her coat or some similar act of courtesy?

12. Is it correct to write or say, "I shall be happy to accept your invitation"?

Answers: 1. "This is a great pleasure. I have been wanting to meet you for some time," "I have heard so much about you." Any of these may be used if they can be said sincerely, but the most simple and non-committal of all is, "How do you do?"

2. No; his name on the card takes the place of a signature.

3. He should lift his hat, but it is not at all necessary for him to stand with his hat in his hand.

4. A buffet breakfast may be served at noon, a luncheon at one or two o'clock, a supper at any time in the evening, or this kind of service may be used for an afternoon or evening reception.

5. No. The words "and family" are no longer in use. An invitation should be sent to Mr. and Mrs. Brown, and a separate invitation to each other member of the family.

6. The woman.

7. Canapés served before a meal or with cocktails are eaten with the fingers. At the table they are eaten, or are other hors d'oeuvres, with a fork.
